TITLE: R-25-18 – Authorizing the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority to Submit Congressionally Directed Spending Grant Requests to the 118th Congress of the United States

ACTION: Recommend Approval

SUMMARY:

The Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority (Water Authority) is making strategic moves to secure funding for crucial infrastructure projects through Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) Grants. These grants are an opportunity for non-profit entities, public institutions, tribal governments, and state and local government to receive financial support for projects that demonstrate significant community support and meet all legal and regulatory requirements.

Recap of the projects and their respective delegates:

- **Senator Martin Heinrich:** Carnuel Water and Wastewater System Infrastructure
- **Senator Ben Ray Lujan:** Sediment Study and Potential Priority Removal in the Rio Chama Watershed
- **Representative Melanie Stansbury:** Aquifer Storage and Recovery Project
- **Representative Gabe Vasquez:** South Valley Project and Southside Water Reclamation Plant Outfall Realignment Project

These initiatives align with the Water Authority's priorities at both the state and federal levels.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact will be determined once the projects are selected and awarded. The process of each grant becoming a separate piece of legislation to be voted upon ensures thorough consideration and accountability.

2 **AUTHORIZING THE ALBUQUERQUE BERNALILLO COUNTY WATER UTILITY**
3 **AUTHORITY TO SUBMIT CONGRESSIONALLY DIRECTED SPENDING GRANT**
4 **REQUESTS TO THE 118TH CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES**

5 WHEREAS, the 118th Congress of the United States established Congressionally
6 Directed Spending (CDS) Requests to support the development and operation of public
7 infrastructure and community-based services. These grants are designed to help state
8 and local governments, as well as public special authorities and nonprofit organizations,
9 fund important projects that benefit the community; and

10 WHEREAS, the New Mexico delegation has invited state and local governments,
11 public special authorities, and nonprofit organizations in New Mexico to submit requests
12 for CDS Grants; and

13 WHEREAS, the Water Authority is responding to this call by submitting
14 applications for five key projects, aiming to improve water management and infrastructure
15 in its service area. This proactive approach aligns with state and federal priorities and
16 demonstrates commitment to community development; and

17 WHEREAS, the projects include: Carnuel Water and Wastewater System
18 Infrastructure, Sediment Study and Potential Priority Removal in the Rio Chama
19 Watershed, Aquifer Storage and Recovery, South Valley Project, and Southside Water
20 Reclamation Plant Outfall Realignment projects.

21 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WATER AUTHORITY:**

22 Section 1. That CDS Grant Requests will be submitted for the Carnuel Water
23 and Wastewater System Infrastructure, Sediment Study and Potential Priority Removal
24 in the Rio Chama Watershed, Aquifer Storage and Recovery, South Valley Project, and
25 Southside Water Reclamation Plant Outfall Realignment projects.

26 Section 2. That the Executive Director will collaborate with the 118th Congress
27 New Mexico Delegation to meet established deadlines for entering into cooperative
28 agreements for any authorized CDS Grants.

1 Section 3. That the Executive Director is authorized to execute CDS Grants
2 cooperative agreements on behalf of the Water Authority.
