TITLE: F/S O-14-2 – Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority (the “Water Authority”) Senior Lien Joint Water and Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014A in the Principal Amount of \$98,420,000 (the “SERIES 2014A BONDS”) for the Purpose of Refunding (i) A Portion of the Outstanding Joint Water and Sewer System New Mexico Finance Authority Public Project Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2005) and (ii) a Portion of the Outstanding Series 2006A Bonds; Authorizing the Issuance and Sale of Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Subordinate Lien Joint Water and Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014B in the Principal Amount of \$88,585,000 (the "SERIES 2014B BONDS" and Together with the Series 2014A Bonds, the “Bonds”) for the Purposes of Refunding (i) a Portion of the Outstanding Series 2005 Bonds and (ii) the Outstanding 2001 New Mexico Environment Department Loan; Providing For the Disposition of, and Other Details Relating to, the Revenues From The Operation of the System Including the Payment of Debt Service On System Obligations; Determining Certain Terms and the Method of Determining Other Terms Concerning the Bonds; Providing for the Approval of Various Agreements and Disclosure Documents Relating to the Bonds; Amending the Water Authority’s Water and Sewer Rate Ordinance No. O-14-1 and Ordinance No. F/S O-08-4; and Ratifying Action Previously Taken

ACTION: Recommend Approval

SUMMARY:

This legislation for the Bond Ordinance for the proposed Joint Water and Sewer System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Senior Lien Series 2014A and Subordinate Lien Series 2014B. The Bond Ordinance establishes certain bond details; provides for the payment of the cost of issuing the bonds; approves disclosure and other documents relating to the bonds.

The purpose of the Bond Ordinance is to refinance all or a portion of the outstanding Joint Water and Sewer System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2005, New Mexico Finance Authority Public Project Revolving Fund Loan (2005), Series 2006 Bonds and the Series 2001 New Mexico Environment Department Loan. A portion of

the refunding, approximately 55%, will be issued as senior lien bonds and the remaining portion will be issued as subordinate lien bonds. The Water Authority is issuing a portion of the refunding bonds on a subordinate lien basis to provide the Water Authority rate covenant flexibility during revenue fluctuation years. The Water Authority's current Senior Lien Bonds are rated Aa2/AA+/AA by Moody's, Standard and Poor's and Fitch Ratings respectively. The Water Authority's new subordinate lien is not currently rated. It is anticipated the Water Authority's subordinate lien will have ratings of one notch lower or Aa3/AA/AA- by Moody's, Standard and Poor's and Fitch Ratings respectively based on coverage requirements. Rating presentations will be schedule for late July / early August. The second reading and final approval of the Bond Ordinance is scheduled for the Water Authority's August 20th Board meeting. The second reading and final approval of the Bond Ordinance will include the final terms, sale price, maximum interest rates, savings achieved and other matters with respect to the Bonds.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Senior Lien Series 2014A and Subordinate Lien Series 2014B Bonds will be issued in two series, with an aggregate principal amount of approximately \$183,425,000, which will refund all or a portion of the Series 2005 Bonds, 2005 NMFA PPRF Loan, Series 2006 Bonds and 2001 NMED Loan. Based upon current market conditions the refunding will generate approximately \$15.7 million in present value savings or 7.81% of the par amount refunded. Annually the refunding is expected to generate approximately \$0.9 million in savings in FY 2015, \$1.3 million in savings in FY 2016 and approximately \$1.66 million from FY 2017 through FY 2025. Gross Revenues, all income and revenues directly or indirectly derived by the Water Authority from the operation and use of the System less operation and maintenance expenses, are pledged as security for these bonds, similar to the Water Authority's prior debt issuances. The term of the debt will not be extended. The savings have been incorporated into the FY/15 Operating Budget and Ten-Year Financial Plan.

COMMENTS:

Approval of the Bond Ordinance is required for the issuance of the proposed refunding bonds. Final action is expected at the Water Authority's August Board meeting

Senior Lien Bond ratings for this issue are as follows: Standard and Poor's (AA+ Stable Outlook), Fitch (AA Stable Outlook) and Moody's (Aa2 Stable Outlook).

Subordinate Lien Bond ratings for this issue are expected as follows: Standard and Poor's (AA Stable Outlook), Fitch (AA- Stable Outlook) and Moody's (Aa3 Stable Outlook).

A substitute to the floor substitute may be prepared by Bond Counsel which makes technical adjustments.

1 Capitalized terms used in the following preambles are defined in Section 1 of
2 this Bond Ordinance, unless the context requires otherwise.

3 WHEREAS, the Water Authority is a legally and regularly created,
4 established, organized and existing public body politic and corporate, separate and
5 apart from the City and the County, under the general laws of the State; and

6 WHEREAS, the Water Authority owns, operates and maintains the System as
7 a joint public utility water and sewer system; and

8 WHEREAS, the Water Authority is obligated on the following Senior
9 Obligations, payable from Net Revenues, Outstanding on the date of the adoption of
10 this Ordinance in the following principal amounts:

14 WHEREAS, pursuant to the Act, the Water Authority is authorized to issue
15 revenue bonds and to use the Bond proceeds to refund previously issued System
16 Obligations; and

17 WHEREAS, except as stated in these preambles, the Net Revenues have not
18 been pledged or hypothecated to the payment of any Outstanding obligations and no
19 other obligations are payable from the Net Revenues on the date of this Bond
20 Ordinance; and

21 WHEREAS, there are no obligations which have a lien on the Net Revenues
22 superior to the lien thereon of Senior Obligations; and

23 WHEREAS, the Board desires to clarify the Rate Covenant on its Outstanding
24 Senior Obligations and to amend Ordinance No. F/S O-08-4 and the Water
25 Authority's Water and Sewer Rate Ordinance No. O-14-1 and Debt Policy to provide
26 consistent provisions across the respective lien levels for its Senior Obligations and
27 Subordinate Obligations; and

28 WHEREAS, the Board desires to refund and refinance the Refunded
29 Obligations to achieve debt service savings and to restructure its outstanding
30 obligations;

1 WHEREAS, the Board hereby determines that (i) the Refunding Project may
2 be financed with proceeds of the Bonds, (ii) that it is necessary and in the best
3 interests of the Water Authority and the residents of the geographic area served by
4 the Water Authority that the Bonds be authorized pursuant to the Act and (iii) that the
5 Refunded Obligations be refunded; and

6 WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it may lawfully pledge the Net
7 Revenues for repayment of the Bonds; and

8 WHEREAS, the Water Authority intends to use the proceeds of the Series
9 2014A Bonds for the purpose of refunding the 2014A Refunded Obligations and to
10 pay the Expenses of issuing the Series 2014A Bonds; and

11 WHEREAS, the Water Authority intends to use the proceeds of the Series
12 2014B Bonds for the purpose of refunding the 2014B Refunded Obligations and to
13 pay the Expenses of issuing the Series 2014B Bonds; and

14 WHEREAS, the Escrow Agent is a commercial bank having full trust powers
15 and is a member of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation; and

16 WHEREAS, there has been presented to the Board for approval the
17 Preliminary Official Statement, the proposed form of Official Statement, the form of
18 Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, the form of the Escrow Agreement, and the
19 Bond Purchase Agreement; and

20 WHEREAS, all required authorizations, consents or approvals of any
21 governmental body, agency or authority in connection with charging the current rates
22 for services of the System and for the authorization, execution and delivery of the
23 Bonds which are required to have been obtained by the date of this Bond Ordinance
24 or which will be required to be obtained prior to the date of issuance of the Bonds
25 have been or will have been obtained by such dates.

26 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE
27 WATER AUTHORITY:

28 Section 1. DEFINITIONS AND RULES OF CONSTRUCTION.

29 (A) DEFINITIONS. As used in this Bond Ordinance, the following
30 terms have the meanings specified, unless the context clearly requires otherwise:

1 ACCRETED VALUE. Unless stated otherwise in an ordinance or
2 resolution of the Board, with respect to an Individual Capital Appreciation Bond, an
3 amount equal to the original principal amount of that Capital Appreciation Bond plus
4 the amount, assuming semiannual compounding of earnings, which would be
5 produced on the investment of such original principal amount, beginning on the
6 dated date of that Individual Capital Appreciation Bond and ending at the Accretion
7 Term Date thereof, at an interest rate which, if continued until the Accretion Term
8 Date, will produce the defined value of an Individual Capital Appreciation Bond at the
9 Accretion Term Date. As of any Valuation Date, the Accreted Value of any Capital
10 Appreciation Bond shall mean the amount set forth for such date in the applicable
11 resolution or ordinance. As of any date other than a Valuation Date, the Accreted
12 Value shall mean the sum of (1) the Accreted Value on the preceding Valuation Date
13 and (2) the product of (a) a fraction, the numerator of which is the number of days
14 having elapsed from the preceding Valuation Date and the denominator of which is
15 the number of days in a single compounding period, and (b) the difference between
16 the Accreted Values for such Valuation Dates.

17 ACCRETION TERM DATE. The maturity date of a Capital
18 Appreciation Bond or other date on which a Capital Appreciation Bond converts to a
19 Current Interest Bond.

20 ACT. Section 72-1-10 NMSA 1978, Sections 3-31-1 to 3-31-12 NMSA
21 1978, Sections 4-61-1 to 4-61-10 NMSA 1978, Sections 6-18-1 through 6-18-16
22 NMSA 1978, and enactments of the Board relating to the Bond Ordinance.

23 AUTHENTICATING AGENT. The Registrar or any trust company,
24 national or state banking association or financial institution qualified to act and
25 appointed as the authenticating agent for the Bonds by an Authorized Officer from
26 time to time.

27 AUTHORIZED DENOMINATIONS. Denominations of \$5,000 or
28 integral multiples of \$5,000.

29 AUTHORIZED OFFICER. The Chair, the Executive Director, or other
30 officer or employee of the Water Authority when designated by a certificate signed
31 by the Chair from time to time.

1 BENEFICIAL OWNERS. Beneficial Owners as defined in Section 7
2 (C).

3 BOARD. The governing body in which is vested the legislative power
4 of the Water Authority.

5 BOND, BONDS OR SERIES 2014 BONDS. Collectively, the
6 Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Senior Lien Joint Water and
7 Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014A issued pursuant to the
8 Bond Legislation in the aggregate principal amount of \$98,420,000 and the
9 Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Subordinate Lien Joint Water
10 and Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014B, issued pursuant to
11 the Bond Legislation, in the principal amount of \$88,585,000.

12 BOND COUNSEL. An attorney at law or a firm of attorneys,
13 designated by the Water Authority, of nationally recognized standing in matters
14 pertaining to the issuance of bonds issued by states and their political subdivisions.

15 BOND INSURANCE POLICY. A municipal bond insurance policy
16 issued by a Credit Source insuring the payment when due of the principal of and
17 interest on Insured Obligations.

18 BOND LEGISLATION. The Bond Ordinance and the Confirming
19 Resolution.

20 BOND ORDINANCE. This ordinance, as amended or supplemented
21 from time to time.

22 BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT. The Bond Purchase Agreement
23 between the Water Authority and the Purchaser for the Bonds.

24 BUSINESS DAY. Any day during which any Credit Source, the Paying
25 Agent or the Registrar, the offices of the Water Authority and the New York Stock
26 Exchange are all open for business during normal business hours.

27 CAPITAL APPRECIATION BONDS. System Obligations on which the
28 first scheduled date for payment of principal and/or interest is the Accretion Term
29 Date. For the purposes of (1) receiving payment of the redemption price if a Capital
30 Appreciation Bond is redeemed prior to maturity or (2) determining the principal
31 amount of System Obligations held by the owner of a Capital Appreciation Bond in

1 giving any notice, consent, request, or demand pursuant to an ordinance or
2 resolution of the Board or related document for any purpose whatsoever, the
3 principal amount of a Capital Appreciation Bond shall be deemed to be its Accreted
4 Value.

5 CHAIR. The duly elected Chair of the Board or the Vice Chair of the
6 Board acting in the absence of the Chair.

7 CITY. The City of Albuquerque, in the County of Bernalillo and State
8 of New Mexico.

9 CLOSING DATE. The date of delivery of the Bonds to the Purchaser
10 or its designee.

11 CODE. The Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, the federal
12 income tax regulations of the Treasury Department (whether proposed, temporary or
13 final) and any amendments of, or successor provisions to, the foregoing and any
14 official rulings, announcements, notices, procedures and judicial determinations
15 regarding any of the foregoing, all as and to the extent applicable. Unless otherwise
16 indicated, reference to a Section of the Code in this Bond Ordinance means that
17 Section of the Code and such applicable regulations, rulings, announcements,
18 notices, procedures and determinations pertinent to that Section.

19 COMPLETION DATE. The date of completion of the Refunding
20 Project.

21 CONFIRMING RESOLUTION. A resolution adopted on the date of
22 adoption of this Bond Ordinance declaring the necessity of the issuance of the
23 Bonds and confirming the terms hereof for purposes of Section 72-1-10(M) NMSA
24 1978, as amended.

25 CONSULTING ENGINEER. Any registered or licensed professional
26 engineer or firm of engineers, entitled to practice and practicing as such under the
27 laws of the State, retained and compensated by the Water Authority but not in the
28 regular employ of the Water Authority, the City or the County; but, as to any
29 construction drawings and specifications prepared for the System by Water Authority
30 or City employees under the supervision of an engineer employed by the City or the
31 Water Authority; this term may include such engineer.

1 CONTINUING DISCLOSURE UNDERTAKING. The undertaking of
2 the Water Authority for the benefit of Owners pursuant to which the Water Authority
3 will agree for the benefit of Owners that, while the Bonds are Outstanding, the Water
4 Authority will annually provide certain financial information and operating data and
5 audited financial statements and will provide notice of certain events in accordance
6 with Rule 15c2-12 promulgated under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

7 COUNSEL. An attorney at law (who may be counsel to the Water
8 Authority).

9 COUNTY. Bernalillo County, New Mexico.

10 CREDIT FACILITY. A letter of credit, line of credit, Bond Insurance
11 Policy or Reserve Account Surety Bond, guaranty or similar agreement provided by
12 a Credit Source whose senior unsecured debt is rated no lower than the current
13 rating on the applicable System Obligations and in any event no lower than "A" by
14 Moody's, S&P and Fitch to the extent each such rating agency is then rating those
15 System Obligations, to provide support to pay the purchase price of, or the payment
16 when due of the principal of and interest on, System Obligations.

17 CREDIT SOURCE. Any bank, insurance company or other financial
18 institution which provides a Credit Facility for a series of System Obligations.

19 DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. An account of the Debt Service Fund for
20 the deposit of Net Revenues and proceeds of a series of System Obligations for the
21 payment of Debt Service Requirements on that series of System Obligations.

22 DEBT SERVICE FUND. The Debt Service Fund previously established
23 by the Water Authority and continued by this Bond Ordinance.

24 DEBT SERVICE REQUIREMENTS. With respect to System
25 Obligations and for any given period, the sum of: (1) the amount required to pay the
26 interest, or to make reimbursements for payments of interest, becoming due on
27 System Obligations during that period, plus (2) the amount required to pay the
28 principal or Accreted Value, or to make reimbursements for the payment of principal
29 or Accreted Value, becoming due on System Obligations during that period, whether
30 at maturity, an accretion term date or upon mandatory sinking fund redemption
31 dates, plus (3) the periodic payments required to be made by the Water Authority

1 pursuant to a Qualified Exchange Agreement minus (4) the periodic payments to be
2 received by the Water Authority pursuant to a Qualified Exchange Agreement. No
3 payments required for any System Obligations which may be tendered or otherwise
4 presented for payment at the option or demand of the owners of System Obligations,
5 or which may occur because of the exercise of an option by the Water Authority, or
6 which may otherwise become due by reason of any other circumstance or
7 contingency, including acceleration or early termination payments, which constitute
8 other than regularly scheduled payments of principal, Accreted Value, interest or
9 other regularly scheduled payments on System Obligations shall be included in any
10 computation of Debt Service Requirements for that period.

11 Unless, at the time of computation of Debt Service Requirements, payments
12 on System Obligations are owed to, or System Obligations are owned or held by, the
13 provider of a Credit Facility pursuant to the provisions of that Credit Facility, the
14 computation of interest for the purposes of this definition shall be made without
15 considering the interest rate payable pursuant to a Credit Facility.

16 In any computation of Debt Service Requirements relating to the issuance of
17 additional System Obligations, there shall be excluded from the computation of the
18 Debt Service Requirements amounts and investments which are irrevocably
19 committed to make designated payments on System Obligations during the
20 applicable period, including, without limitation, money on deposit in any Debt Service
21 Account and amounts on deposit in an escrow account irrevocably committed to
22 make designated payments on System Obligations during the applicable period and
23 earnings on such investments which are payable and committed to the payment of
24 such System Obligations during the applicable period. For the purpose of the
25 definition of Debt Service Requirements, the Accreted Value of Capital Appreciation
26 Bonds becoming due shall be included in the calculation of accrued and unpaid and
27 accruing interest and principal only from and after the date which is one year prior to
28 the date on which the Accreted Value becomes payable.

29 Unless otherwise required by a Water Authority ordinance or resolution
30 relating to a series of System Obligations, to determine Debt Service Requirements
31 of Variable Rate Obligations, the Water Authority shall use the procedures set forth

1 in the following paragraphs to determine the amount of interest or other payments to
2 be paid by the Water Authority on Variable Rate Obligations and the amount of
3 credit against Debt Service Requirements for payments to be received by the Water
4 Authority based upon Variable Rate Obligations to be made by a counterparty
5 pursuant to a Qualified Exchange Agreement.

6 (1) During any historical period for which the actual variable
7 interest rate or rates are determinable, the actual variable interest rate shall be used.
8 During any historical period when the actual variable interest rate is not
9 determinable, the variable interest rate shall, for the purpose of determining Debt
10 Service Requirements, be deemed to be the higher of:

11 (a) the actual variable interest rate, if any, at the time
12 of computation; or

13 (b) a fixed annual rate equal to the prevailing rate on
14 the Variable Rate Obligations on the date of computation (which, for the purpose of
15 determining the debt service reserve requirement, shall be the date of initial
16 issuance of the applicable System Obligations) as certified by the Water Authority's
17 financial advisor, the purchaser of the System Obligations, an investment banker
18 designated by the Water Authority from time to time or a counterparty with respect to
19 a Qualified Exchange Agreement.

20 (2) Prospective computations of interest payable on Variable
21 Rate Obligations, including those relating to the issuance of additional System
22 Obligations required by Section 27 or required by the Rate Covenant, shall be made
23 on the assumption that such obligations bear interest at a fixed annual rate equal to:

24 (a) the average of the daily rates of such System
25 Obligations during the 365 consecutive days (or any lesser period such System
26 Obligations have been Outstanding) next preceding a date which is no more than 60
27 days prior to the date of the issuance of the additional Subordinate Obligations; or

28 (b) with respect to System Obligations initially issued
29 or incurred as or being converted to Variable Rate Obligations, the estimated initial
30 rate of interest of such System Obligations upon the date of issuance, exchange or
31 conversion as certified by the Water Authority's financial advisor, another investment

1 banker, as designated by the Water Authority from time to time, or a counterparty
2 with respect to a Qualified Exchange Agreement.

3 DEFEASANCE OBLIGATIONS.

4 (1) Government Obligations; or

5 (2) if permitted by law, other obligations which would result in
6 the defeased Bonds receiving the same rating from any national rating agency then
7 rating such series of bonds as would have been received if the obligations described
8 in clause (1) of this definition had been used.

9 DEPOSITORIES. The following registered securities depository: The
10 Depository Trust Company, 55 Water Street, 22nd Floor, New York, New York
11 11220, Fax (212) 855-8440; or in accordance with then-current guidelines of the
12 Securities and Exchange Commission, to such other addresses and/or such other
13 securities depositories, or no such depositories, as the Water Authority, by an
14 Authorized Officer, may designate in a certificate of the Water Authority.

15 DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND LOAN AGREEMENT
16 (2003). The loan agreement dated April 11, 2003 between the NMFA and the City in
17 the original principal amount of \$3,600,000, authorized and approved by City
18 Ordinance Enactment No. 10-2002 and Resolution Enactment No. 19-2003
19 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

20 DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND LOAN AGREEMENT
21 (2008). The loan agreement dated November 7, 2008 between the NMFA and the
22 Water Authority in the original principal amount of \$12,000,000, authorized and
23 approved by Water Authority Ordinance Enactment No. F/S O-08-4 and Resolution
24 Enactment No. F/S R-08-13 as amended by this Bond Ordinance and the
25 Amendment to the Loan Agreement dated July 24, 2014 constituting a subordinate
26 lien on the Net Revenues.

27 DRINKING WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND LOAN AGREEMENT
28 (2009). The loan agreement between the NMFA and the Water Authority in the
29 original principal amount of \$1,010,000, authorized and approved by Water Authority
30 Ordinance Enactment No. O-09-9 and Resolution Enactment No. R-09-24
31 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

1 EID. The New Mexico Environment Department, formerly the New
2 Mexico Environmental Improvement Division of the Health and Environment
3 Department of the State.

4 EID LOAN. As of the date of adoption of the Bond Ordinance: The
5 loan made to the City by EID, evidenced by a Loan Agreement dated June 18, 2002,
6 authorized by City Ordinance No. 58–2001 in the original principal amount of
7 \$15,000,000 constituting a subordinate lien on the Net Revenues and to be refunded
8 in whole with the proceeds of the Series 2014B Bonds on the Closing Date.

9 ELECTRONIC MEANS. Telephone, telecopy, telegraph, email,
10 facsimile transmission or any other similar means of electronic communication. Any
11 communication by telephone as an Electronic Means shall promptly be confirmed in
12 writing, which may be by one of the other means of electronic communication listed
13 in this definition.

14 EMMA. The Municipal Securities Rulemaking Bonds Electronic
15 Municipal Market Access System located on its website at emma.msrb.org.

16 ESCROW AGENT. BOKF, N.A. dba Bank of Albuquerque, a
17 commercial bank and a member of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation
18 having full and complete trust powers, or its duly authorized successor.

19 ESCROW AGREEMENT. The escrow agreement relating to the
20 refunding of the Refunded Obligations between the Water Authority and the Escrow
21 Agent.

22 ESCROW FUNDS. The escrow funds for the Refunded Obligations
23 created in Section 20 to be maintained by the Escrow Agent.

24 EXPENSE ACCOUNT. That account established for the purpose of
25 appropriating for the annual budget that part of the Operation and Maintenance
26 Expenses which are reasonably necessary for the administration of the Debt Service
27 Fund and which is a separate account of the Debt Service Fund.

28 EXPENSES. The reasonable and necessary fees, costs and
29 expenses incurred by the Water Authority with respect to the issuance of, including
30 disclosure matters pertaining to, the Bonds, including, without limitation, attorneys'
31 fees, premiums and costs for any Credit Facility, costs of advertising and publication,

1 underwriter's discounts, cost of printing bonds and disclosure documents, fees and
2 costs of the Escrow Agent, legal fees and expenses, costs relating to the initial
3 purchase of securities for deposit with the Escrow Agent, including any costs
4 associated with any verification agent, and expenses of any Independent Accountant
5 and all reasonable and necessary fees and administrative costs of the Water
6 Authority relating to the foregoing.

7 FISCAL YEAR. The twelve-month period beginning on the first day of
8 July of each year and ending on the last day of June of the next succeeding year, or
9 any other twelve-month period, which the Water Authority designates.

10 FITCH. Fitch Ratings, its successors and assigns, and, if such entity is
11 dissolved or liquidated or no longer performs the functions of a securities ratings
12 agency, "Fitch" shall be deemed to refer to any other nationally recognized securities
13 rating agency designated by the Water Authority.

14 GOVERNMENT OBLIGATIONS. Direct obligations of, or obligations
15 the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by, the United
16 States of America, or certificates or receipts established by the United States
17 Government or its agencies or instrumentalities representing direct ownership of
18 future interests or principal payments on direct obligations of, or obligations fully
19 guaranteed by, the United States of America or any of its agencies or
20 instrumentalities the obligations of which are backed by the full faith and credit of the
21 United States, which obligations are held by a custodian in safekeeping on behalf of
22 the holders of such receipts, and rated or assessed in its highest Rating Category by
23 S&P, if then rating the Bonds, by Fitch, if then rating the Bonds, and by Moody's, if
24 then rating the Bonds.

25 GROSS REVENUES. All income and revenues directly or indirectly
26 derived by the Water Authority from the operation and use of the System, or any part
27 of the System, and includes, without limitation, all revenues received by the Water
28 Authority, or any municipal corporation or agency succeeding to the rights of the
29 Water Authority, from the System and from the sale and use of water, water services
30 or facilities, sewer service or facilities or any other service, commodity or facility or
31 any combination thereof furnished to the inhabitants of the geographic area served

1 by the Water Authority by means of the System as the same may at any time exist to
2 serve customers outside the Water Authority's geographical limits as well as
3 customers within the Water Authority's geographical limits. Such term also includes:

4 (1) All income derived from the investment of any money in
5 the Acquisition Fund, Joint Water and Sewer Fund, Debt Service Fund and Rate
6 Stabilization Fund and income derived from surplus Net Revenues;

7 (2) Money released from the Rebate Fund to the Water
8 Authority;

9 (3) Money released from the Rate Stabilization Fund to the
10 Water Authority to the extent that the amount released is used to pay Operation and
11 Maintenance Expenses or Debt Service Requirements on System Obligations in the
12 year released; provided that withdrawals from the Rate Stabilization Fund shall not
13 be included in Gross Revenues for the purposes of the Rate Covenant in any two
14 consecutive calendar years;

15 (4) Property insurance proceeds which are not necessary to
16 restore or replace the property lost or damaged and the proceeds of the sale or
17 other disposition of any part of the System; and.

18 (5) On and after July 1, 2006, funds received from users of
19 the System as a reimbursement of, or otherwise in connection with, franchise fees to
20 be paid by the Water Authority.

21 Gross Revenues do not include:

22 (1) any money received as grants or gifts from the United
23 States of America, the State or other sources, or the proceeds of any charge or tax
24 intended as a replacement therefor or other capital contributions from any source
25 which are restricted as to use; and

26 (2) condemnation proceeds or the proceeds of any
27 insurance policy, except any property insurance proceeds described above in clause
28 (4) of this definition or in Section 29.(L) or derived in respect of loss of use or
29 business interruption.

30 HISTORIC TEST PERIOD. Any period of 12 consecutive months out
31 of the 24 calendar months next preceding the delivery of additional Senior

1 Obligations pursuant to Section 27.(B) or additional Subordinate Obligations
2 pursuant to Section 27.(C).

3 INDEPENDENT ACCOUNTANT. Any certified public accountant,
4 registered accountant, or firm of accountants duly licensed to practice and practicing
5 as such under the laws of the State, appointed and paid by the Water Authority who
6 (a) is, in fact, independent and not under the domination of the Water Authority, the
7 City or the County, (b) does not have any substantial interest, direct or indirect, with
8 the Water Authority, the City or the County, and (c) is not connected with the Water
9 Authority as an officer or employee of the Water Authority, but who may be regularly
10 retained to make annual or similar audits of the books or records of the Water
11 Authority, the City or the County.

12 INSURED BANK. A bank insured by an agency of the United States.

13 INSURED OBLIGATIONS. System Obligations insured by a Bond
14 Insurance Policy or payable with the proceeds of another Credit Facility.

15 INTEREST PAYMENT DATE. January 1 and July 1 of each year (or if
16 such day is not a Business Day, then the next succeeding Business Day) beginning
17 on the date set forth in the Confirming Resolution.

18 JOINT WATER AND SEWER FUND. The "City of Albuquerque, New
19 Mexico, Joint Water and Sewer Fund" originally established in Section 16 of
20 Ordinance No. 18-1984 and continued by this Ordinance as the "Albuquerque
21 Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water and Sewer Fund."

22 MOODY'S. Moody's Investors Service, Inc., a corporation organized
23 and existing under the laws of the State of Delaware, its successors and their
24 assigns, and, if such corporation does not provide a rating for the Bonds, "Moody's"
25 shall be deemed to refer to any other nationally recognized securities rating agency
26 rating the Bonds.

27 NMFA. The New Mexico Finance Authority.

28 NMSA 1978. New Mexico Statutes Annotated, 1978 Compilation, as
29 amended and supplemented.

30 NET REVENUES. The Gross Revenues after deducting Operation
31 and Maintenance Expenses.

1 OFFICIAL STATEMENT. The final disclosure document relating to the
2 offer and sale of the Bonds (including the cover page and all summary statement
3 appendices and other materials included or incorporated by reference or attached
4 thereto), as amended or supplemented.

5 OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE EXPENSES. All reasonable and
6 necessary current expenses of the System, paid or accrued, related to operating,
7 maintaining and repairing the System including, without limiting the generality of the
8 foregoing:

9 (1) legal and overhead expenses directly related and
10 reasonably allocable to the administration of the System;

11 (2) insurance premiums for the System, including, without
12 limitation, premiums for property insurance, public liability insurance and workmen's
13 compensation insurance, whether or not self-funded;

14 (3) premiums, expenses and other costs (other than required
15 reimbursements of insurance proceeds and other amounts advanced to pay Debt
16 Service Requirements on System Obligations) for Credit Facilities;

17 (4) Expenses other than expenses paid from the proceeds of
18 System Obligations;

19 (5) the costs of audits of the books and accounts of the
20 Water Authority and the System;

21 (6) amounts required to be deposited in the Rebate Fund or
22 otherwise required to make rebate payments to the United States Government;

23 (7) salaries, administrative expenses, labor costs, surety
24 bonds and the cost of materials and supplies used for or in connection with the
25 current operation of the System; and

26 (8) franchise tax payments to the City, County or any other
27 local government.

28 Operation and Maintenance Expenses do not include any allowance for
29 depreciation, payments in lieu of taxes, liabilities incurred by the Water Authority as
30 a result of its negligence or other misconduct in the operation of the System or any
31 charges for the accumulation of reserves for capital replacements. Operation and

1 Maintenance Expenses do not include any payment of or reimbursement for the
2 payment of Debt Service Requirements or premiums on the Bonds or liabilities
3 incurred by the Water Authority as the result of negligence in the operation of the
4 System.

5 OUTSTANDING. When used in reference to System Obligations, on
6 any particular date, the aggregate of all System Obligations issued and delivered
7 under the applicable Water Authority or City ordinance authorizing the issuance of,
8 System Obligations except:

9 (1) those canceled at or prior to such date or delivered to or
10 acquired by the Water Authority or the City at or prior to such date for cancellation;

11 (2) those which have been paid or are deemed to be paid in
12 accordance with the Water Authority or City ordinance or resolution authorizing the
13 issuance of the applicable System Obligations or otherwise relating thereto, provided
14 that the payment of Insured Obligations with the proceeds of a Bond Insurance
15 Policy shall not result in those Insured Obligations ceasing to be Outstanding;

16 (3) in the case of Variable Rate Obligations, System
17 Obligations deemed tendered but not yet presented for payment;

18 (4) those Bonds which have been refunded in accordance
19 with this Bond Ordinance or other ordinance of the Water Authority authorizing the
20 defeasance of the applicable bonds; and

21 (5) those in lieu of or in exchange or substitution for which
22 other System Obligations shall have been delivered, unless proof satisfactory to the
23 Water Authority or the City and the Paying Agent for the applicable System
24 Obligations is presented that any System Obligation for which a new System
25 Obligation was issued or exchanged is held by a bona fide holder in due course.

26 OWNER. The registered owner or owners of any Bond as shown on
27 the registration books maintained by the Registrar.

28 PAYING AGENT. The chief financial officer or successor in function of
29 the Water Authority or any trust company, national or state banking association or
30 financial institution qualified to act, appointed as the paying agent for the Bonds by
31 an Authorized Officer from time to time.

1 PERMITTED INVESTMENTS. Any of the following which at the time
2 of the investment are legal investments for the Water Authority for the money to be
3 invested and any other investments, subject to approval by S&P, Fitch and Moody's,
4 if then rating the Bonds, which at the time of investment are legal investments of the
5 Water Authority for the money to be invested:

6 (1) Government Obligations, but not including: General
7 Services Administration -- participation certificates; Government National Mortgage
8 Association (GNMA) -- GNMA guaranteed mortgage-backed securities and GNMA
9 guaranteed participation certificates; U.S. Department of Housing & Urban
10 Development -- local authority bonds; and U.S. Export-Import Bank;

11 (2) Obligations of the following government-sponsored
12 agencies: Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation -- participation certificates and
13 senior debt obligations; Farm Credit System (formerly: Federal Land Banks and
14 Banks for Cooperatives) -- consolidated system-wide bonds and notes; Federal
15 Home Loan Banks -- consolidated debt obligations; Federal National Mortgage
16 Association -- senior debt obligations and mortgage-backed securities (excluding
17 stripped mortgage securities which are valued greater than par on the portion of
18 unpaid principal); letter of credit backed issues; Financing Corporation -- debt
19 obligations; and Resolution Funding Corporation -- debt obligations;

20 (3) Certificates of deposit, time deposits and banker's
21 acceptances of any bank or savings and loan association, the short-term obligations
22 of which are rated in the highest Rating Category by S&P, Fitch and Moody's, if then
23 rating the Bonds, provided that such deposits must be fully secured by securities
24 designated in paragraphs (1), (2) and (8) of this definition and held in safe-keeping
25 for, or on behalf of, or held in book-entry form in the name of, the Water Authority;

26 (4) Accounts with banks, savings and loan associations, and
27 credit unions located in Bernalillo County, provided that the banks, savings and loan
28 associations and credit unions, and the collateral securing the investments permitted
29 by this paragraph, satisfy the requirements of applicable State law;

30 (5) Obligations, the interest on which is excluded from gross
31 income of the recipient for federal income tax purposes, which are rated in the

1 highest Rating Category by S&P, Fitch and Moody's, if then rating the Bonds;

2 (6) Money market instruments and other securities of
3 commercial banks, broker-dealers or recognized financial investors, which securities
4 or institutions are rated in the highest Rating Category by S&P, Fitch and Moody's, if
5 then rating the Bonds, or which securities are guaranteed by a person or entity
6 whose long-term debt obligations are rated in the highest Rating Category by S&P,
7 Fitch and Moody's, if then rating the Bonds, including, without limitation, securities
8 of, or other interests in, any open-end or closed-end management type investment
9 company or investment trust registered under the provisions of 15 U.S.C. Sections
10 80(a)-1 et. seq., which invest only in, or whose securities are secured only by,
11 obligations of the type set forth in paragraphs (1), (2) and (8) of this definition;

12 (7) The "participating government investment fund"
13 described in Section 6-10-10.1 NMSA. 1978 or other similar pooled fund maintained
14 by the State for the investment of public funds of local public bodies of the State;

15 (8) Stripped Securities: (i) U.S. Treasury STRIPS and (ii)
16 REFCORP STRIPS (stripped by Federal Reserve Bank of New York);

17 (9) Repurchase agreements involving the purchase and sale
18 of, and guaranteed investment contracts, the par value of which is collateralized by a
19 perfected first pledge of, or security interest in, or the payments of which are
20 unconditionally guaranteed by, securities described in parts (1), (2) and (8) of this
21 definition, which collateral is held by the Water Authority, or for the benefit of the
22 Water Authority, by a party other than the provider of the guaranteed investment
23 contract or repurchase agreement, with a collateralized value of at least 102% of the
24 par value of such repurchase agreement or guaranteed investment contract or 102%
25 of the market value thereof, valued at intervals of no less than monthly and which
26 collateral is not subject to any other pledge or security interest;

27 (10) Deposits insured at all times by the Federal Deposit
28 Insurance Corporation or otherwise collateralized with Government Obligations; and

29 (11) Agreements which permit the Water Authority to require a

11 on the first day of the month following the estimated Completion Date of the project
12 for which additional Senior Obligations or Subordinate Obligations are proposed to
13 be issued pursuant to Section 27.(B) or Section 27.(C), respectively, or the first day
14 of the thirty-sixth month following the delivery of such Senior Obligations or
15 Subordinate Obligations, whichever is earlier.

16 PUBLIC PROJECT REVOLVING FUND LOAN AGREEMENT (2005).
17 The loan agreement dated October 28, 2005 between the NMFA and the Water
18 Authority in the principal amount of \$20,000,000 and approved by Ordinance No. O-
19 05-3 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues. Proceeds from the Series
20 2014A Bonds shall be applied to the advance refunding of the Public Project
21 Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2005) maturing on and after May 1, 2016 on the
22 first optional redemption date of May 1, 2015.

23 PUBLIC PROJECT REVOLVING FUND LOAN AGREEMENT (2007).
24 The loan agreement dated September 26, 2007 between the NMFA and the Water
25 Authority in the principal amount of \$77,005,000 and approved by Ordinance No. O-
26 07-6 and Resolution No. R-07-26 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

27 PUBLIC PROJECT REVOLVING FUND LOAN AGREEMENT (2011).
28 The loan agreement dated December 15, 2011 between the NMFA and the Water
29 Authority in the principal amount of \$49,100,000 and approved by Ordinance No. O-
30 11-5 and Resolution No. R-11-17 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

31 PURCHASER. J.P. Morgan Securities LLC, Robert W. Baird & Co.,

1 Incorporated, Stifel, Nicolaus & Company, Incorporated, and Piper Jaffray & Co.
2 collectively, as the original purchasers of the Bonds.

3 QUALIFIED EXCHANGE AGREEMENT. Any financial arrangement
4 between the Water Authority and a counterparty which, when entered into by the
5 Water Authority, satisfies the requirements of Section 6-18-8.1 NMSA 1978.

6 RATE COVENANT. The covenant in Section 29.(C) relating to
7 charging rates for use of the System to pay Debt Service Requirements.

8 RATE STABILIZATION FUND. The Rate Stabilization Fund for
9 System Obligations previously established by the Water Authority and continued by
10 this Bond Ordinance.

11 RATING CATEGORY. A generic securities rating category, without
12 regard, in the case of a long-term rating category, to any refinement or gradation of
13 such long-term rating category by a numerical modifier or otherwise.

14 REBATE FUND. The Rebate Fund for System Obligations previously
15 established by the Water Authority and continued by this Bond Ordinance.

16 RECORD DATE. The fifteenth day of the calendar month preceding
17 each Interest Payment Date.

18 REFUNDED OBLIGATIONS. Collectively, the Series 2014A Refunded
19 Obligations and the Series 2014B Refunded Obligations.

20 REFUNDING PROJECT. Collectively, the Series 2014A Refunding
21 Project and the Series 2014B Refunding Project.

22 REGISTRAR. The chief financial officer or successor in function of the
23 Water Authority or any trust company, national or state banking association or
24 financial institution qualified to act and appointed as the registrar for the Bonds by an
25 Authorized Officer from time to time.

26 RESERVE ACCOUNT. The accounts of the Debt Service Fund to be
27 established for Senior Obligations or Subordinate Obligations with a reserve
28 requirement.

29 RESERVE ACCOUNT SURETY BOND. Any policy of insurance or
30 surety bond or other Credit Facility issued to the Water Authority to be deposited in a
31 Reserve Account, the proceeds of which shall be used to prevent deficiencies in the

1 payment of the principal of or interest on a series of System Obligations, written by
2 an insurer whose policies of insurance, or issued by a Credit Source whose Credit
3 Facility, would not adversely affect the rating of the System Obligations by either
4 Moody's, S&P or Fitch if the Bonds are then rated by Moody's, S&P or Fitch. At the
5 time of the issuance of such policy, such insurer or the component insurance
6 companies thereof or the obligations thereof shall have received the highest policy
7 claims rating accorded insurers by the A. M. Best Company or any comparable
8 service and either of the two highest rating categories of Moody's, S&P or Fitch if the
9 Bonds are then rated by Moody's, S&P or Fitch.

10 S&P. Standard & Poor's Ratings Services, a division of the McGraw-
11 Hill Companies, Inc., its successors and their assigns, and, if such corporation does
12 not provide a rating for the Bonds, "S&P" shall be deemed to refer to any other
13 nationally recognized securities agency rating the Bonds.

14 SENIOR OBLIGATIONS. The Drinking Water State Revolving Fund
15 Loan Agreement (2003), the Series 2005 Bonds, the Public Project Revolving Fund
16 Loan Agreement (2005), the Series 2006A Bonds, the Public Project Revolving Fund
17 Loan Agreement (2007), the Series 2008A Bonds, the Series 2009 Bonds, the
18 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2009), the Public Project
19 Revolving Fund Loan (2011), the Series 2013A&B Bonds, the Series 2014A Bonds,
20 and obligations related thereto designated as Senior Obligations, in any ordinance or
21 resolution of the Water Authority relating to those bonds, and any other System
22 Obligations issued with a lien on the Net Revenues on a parity with the lien of the
23 Outstanding Senior Obligations on Net Revenues.

24 SERIES 2005 BONDS. The Outstanding System Obligations
25 designated as "Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water
26 and Sewer System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2005," in the original
27 principal amount of \$132,985,000 authorized and issued pursuant to Ordinance
28 Enactment No. O-05-2 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues. Proceeds of
29 the Series 2014B Bonds shall be used to advance refund the Series 2005 Bonds
30 maturing on and after July 1, 2016 on their first optional redemption date of July 1,
31 2015.

1 SERIES 2006A BONDS. The System Obligations designated as
2 “Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water and Sewer
3 System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2006A” in the original principal
4 amount of \$133,390,000, authorized and issued pursuant to Ordinance No. O-06-2
5 and R-06-6 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues. Proceeds from the
6 Series 2014A Bonds shall be used to advance refund the Series 2006A Bonds
7 maturing on and after July 1, 2017 on their first optional redemption date of July 1,
8 2016.

9 SERIES 2008A BONDS. The System Obligations designated as
10 “Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water and Sewer
11 System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2008A” in the original principal
12 amount of \$55,630,000, authorized and issued pursuant to Ordinance No. O-08-2,
13 and Resolution No. R-08-5 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

14 SERIES 2009 BONDS. The System Obligations designated as
15 “Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water and Sewer
16 System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2009A-1” in the original principal
17 amount of \$135,990,000, authorized and issued pursuant to Ordinance No. O-09-1
18 and Resolution No. R-09-7 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

19 SERIES 2013A&B BONDS. The System Obligations designated as
20 the “Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water and Sewer
21 System Improvement Revenue Bonds, Series 2013A” and the “Albuquerque
22 Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Joint Water and Sewer System Refunding
23 Revenue Bonds, Series 2013B” in the combined original principal amount of
24 \$118,215,000, authorized and issued pursuant to Ordinance No. O-13-2 and
25 Resolution R-13-13 constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

26 SERIES 2014A BONDS. The Senior System Obligations designated
27 as the “Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Senior Lien Joint Water
28 and Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014A” in the original
29 principal amount of \$98,420,000, authorized and issued pursuant to the Bond
30 Legislation constituting a senior lien on the Net Revenues.

1 SERIES 2014B BONDS. The Subordinate System Obligations
2 designated as the “Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority
3 Subordinate Lien Joint Water and Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series
4 2014B” in the original principal amount of \$88,585,000, authorized and issued
5 pursuant to the Bond Legislation constituting a subordinate lien on the Net
6 Revenues.

7 SERIES 2014A BONDS DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. An account of
8 the Debt Service Fund established for the deposit of amounts necessary to pay the
9 Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014A Bonds.

10 SERIES 2014B BONDS DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. An account of
11 the Debt Service Fund established for the deposit of amounts necessary to pay the
12 Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014B Bonds.

13 SERIES 2014A REFUNDED OBLIGATIONS. The Public Project
14 Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2005) maturing on and after May 1, 2016 and the
15 Series 2006A Bonds maturing on and after July 1, 2017.

16 SERIES 2014B REFUNDED OBLIGATIONS. The Series 2005 Bonds
17 maturing on and after July 1, 2016 and all of the outstanding EID Loan.

18 SERIES 2014A REFUNDING PROJECT. The advance refunding of
19 the Series 2014A Refunded Obligations and the payment of Expenses related to the
20 issuance of the Series 2014A Bonds.

21 SERIES 2014B REFUNDING PROJECT. The advance refunding of
22 the Series 2005 Bonds maturing on and after July 1, 2016, the current refunding of
23 all of the outstanding EID Loan on the date of issuance of the Series 2014B Bonds,
24 and the payment of Expenses related to the issuance of the Series 2014B Bonds.

25 STATE. The State of New Mexico.

26 SUBORDINATE OBLIGATIONS. The EID Loan, the Drinking Water
27 State Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2008), the Series 2014B Bonds, and all
28 other bonds and other obligations of the Water Authority (including those previously
29 issued by the City) now or hereafter issued with a lien on the Net Revenues
30 subordinate to the lien of Senior Obligations and superior to the lien of the Super
31 Subordinated Obligations on the Net Revenues.

1 SUPER SUBORDINATED OBLIGATIONS. The Water Trust Board
2 Loans, and all other bonds and other obligations of the Water Authority now or
3 hereafter issued with a lien on the Net Revenues subordinate to the lien of the
4 Senior Obligations and subordinate to the lien of the Subordinate Obligations on the
5 Net Revenues.

6 SYSTEM. The public utility owned by the Water Authority and
7 designated as the Water Authority's water system and sanitary sewer system
8 (continued as a joint utility system in Section 4) consisting of all properties, real,
9 personal, mixed or otherwise, now owned or hereafter acquired by the Water
10 Authority, through purchase, construction or otherwise, including all extensions,
11 enlargements and improvements of or to the water and sanitary sewer system and
12 used in connection therewith or relating thereto, and any other related activity or
13 enterprise of the Water Authority designated by the Board as part of the water and
14 sanitary sewer system, whether situated within or without the geographical limits of
15 the Water Authority.

16 SYSTEM OBLIGATIONS. All bonds and other similar indebtedness
17 payable solely or primarily from Net Revenues, including, without limitation, the
18 Senior Obligations, the Subordinate Obligations and the Super Subordinated
19 Obligations.

20 VALUATION DATE. Unless stated otherwise in an ordinance or
21 resolution of the Board, each January 1 and July 1 while Capital Appreciation Bonds
22 are Outstanding, being the dates on which the Accreted Value of Capital
23 Appreciation Bonds are listed in the applicable ordinance or resolution.

24 VARIABLE RATE OBLIGATIONS. System Obligations, including
25 reimbursement obligations pursuant to a Credit Facility, the interest rate on which is
26 subject to change from time to time.

27 WATER AUTHORITY. The Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water
28 Utility Authority created by Section 72-1-10 NMSA 1978 as a joint agency of the City
29 and the County and operating under the name Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water
30 Utility Authority.

1 WATER TRUST BOARD. The board created by Section 72-4A-4
2 NMSA 1978.

3 WATER TRUST BOARD LOANS. As of the date of adoption of the
4 Bond Ordinance: (i) the 2009 loan made to the Water Authority by the Water Trust
5 Board, evidenced by that loan agreement # 51-WTB in the amount of \$50,000; (ii)
6 the 2009 loan made to the Water Authority by the Water Trust Board, evidenced by
7 that loan agreement # 79-WTB in the amount of \$100,000; (iii) the 2010 loan made
8 to the Water Authority by the Water Trust Board, evidenced by the loan agreement #
9 177-WTB in the amount of \$190,235; (iv) the 2011 loan made to the Water Authority
10 by the Water Trust Board, evidenced by that loan agreement # 205-WTB in the
11 amount of \$452,000; (v) the 2011 loan made to the Water Authority by the Water
12 Trust Board, evidenced by that loan agreement # 206-WTB in the amount of
13 \$640,000; and (vi) the 2011 loan made to the Water Authority by the Water Trust
14 Board, evidenced by that loan agreement # 207-WTB in the amount of \$63,354.

15 (B) RULES OF CONSTRUCTION. For purposes of this Bond
16 Ordinance, unless otherwise expressly provided or unless the context requires
17 otherwise:

18 (1) Unless otherwise stated in this Bond Ordinance, all
19 references in this Bond Ordinance to designated Sections and other subdivisions are
20 to the designated Section and other subdivisions of this Bond Ordinance.

21 (2) The words “herein”, “hereof”, “hereunder”, and “herewith”
22 and other words of similar import in this Bond Ordinance refer to this Bond
23 Ordinance, as a whole, and not to any particular Section or other subdivision.

24 (3) All accounting terms not otherwise defined in this Bond
25 Ordinance have the meanings assigned to them in accordance with generally
26 accepted accounting principles.

27 (4) Words of the masculine gender shall be deemed and
28 construed to include correlative words of the feminine and neuter genders.

29 (5) The headings used in this Bond Ordinance are for
30 convenience of reference only and shall not define or limit the provisions of this
31 Bond Ordinance.

1 (6) Terms in the singular include the plural and vice versa.

2 Section 2. RATIFICATION. All actions previously taken (not inconsistent
3 with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance) by the Board and the officers of the
4 Water Authority, directed toward the authorization, pledge, collection and distribution
5 of the Net Revenues, the Refunding Project, and the authorization, issuance and
6 sale of the Bonds are ratified, approved and confirmed.

7 Section 3. FINDINGS.

8 (A) The Water Authority declares that it has considered all relevant
9 information and data and finds that the issuance of the Series 2014A Bonds in the
10 principal amount of \$98,420,000 and the Series 2014B Bonds in the principal
11 amount of \$88,585,000 under the Act to provide funds to finance the Refunding
12 Project is necessary and in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the
13 residents of the geographic area served by the Water Authority.

14 (B) The Water Authority will finance the Series 2014A Refunding
15 Project with the proceeds of the Series 2014A Bonds, together with other funds of
16 the Water Authority, if necessary. The Water Authority will finance the Series 2014B
17 Refunding Project with the proceeds of the Series 2014B Bonds, together with other
18 funds of the Water Authority, if necessary.

19 (C) It is economically feasible to accomplish the Refunding Project
20 by the issuance of the Bonds.

21 Section 4. JOINT UTILITY. The System shall continue to be operated and
22 maintained as a joint public utility.

23 Section 5. LIABILITY FOR OUTSTANDING SYSTEM OBLIGATIONS.
24 The Water Authority hereby confirms that, in accordance with Section 72-1-10
25 NMSA 1978, the Water Authority has assumed all of the outstanding obligations that
26 were entered into by the City prior to the Water Authority's acquisition of the System.

27 Section 6. AUTHORIZATION OF REFUNDING PROJECT; EXPENSES.

28 (A) REFUNDING PROJECT. The Refunding Project is hereby
29 authorized and approved.

30 (B) EXPENSES. The payment of Expenses is authorized and
31 approved.

1 (C) PROCEEDS. The net proceeds of the Bonds will be used
2 exclusively to finance the Refunding Project including the payment of Expenses.

3 (D) ADVANCE REFUNDINGS AND CURRENT REFUNDING. The
4 Public Project Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2005) maturing on and after May 1,
5 2016, the Series 2005 Bonds maturing on and after July 1, 2016, and the Series
6 2006A Bonds maturing on and after July 1, 2017 will be advance refunded by
7 depositing funds with the Escrow Agent on the Closing Date to prepay on the
8 respective first optional redemption date for the Public Project Revolving Fund Loan
9 Agreement (2005), the Series 2005 Bonds, and the Series 2006A Bonds, those
10 amounts due at a redemption price of 100% of the principal amount thereof plus
11 interest to the redemption date. The EID Loan shall be currently refunded on the
12 Closing Date at a prepayment price of 100% of the principal amount outstanding on
13 the EID Loan plus interest to the prepayment date.

14 Section 7. THE BONDS.

15 (A) AUTHORIZATIONS. This Bond Ordinance has been adopted
16 by the affirmative vote of at least a majority of all of the members of the Board. For
17 the purpose of protecting the public health, conserving the property, protecting the
18 general welfare and prosperity of the citizens of the geographic area served by the
19 Water Authority, and completing the Refunding Project, it is necessary that the
20 Water Authority issue, and the Water Authority is hereby authorized to issue,
21 pursuant to the Act, its negotiable, fully registered bonds designated as the
22 "Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Senior Lien Joint Water and
23 Sewer System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014A" and the "Albuquerque
24 Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority Subordinate Lien Joint Water and Sewer
25 System Refunding Revenue Bonds, Series 2014B."

26 The Series 2014A Bonds shall be issued in the principal amount of
27 \$98,420,000, to be used, with other available moneys of the Water Authority, to
28 finance the Series 2014A Refunding Project including the payment of Expenses.
29 The Series 2014B Bonds shall be issued in the principal amount of \$88,585,000 to
30 be used, with other available moneys of the Water Authority, to finance the Series
31 2014B Refunding Project.

1 (B) DETAILS OF THE BONDS.

2 (1) General. The Bonds shall be issued as fully registered
3 bonds in one or more series and shall be issued to provide funds, together with other
4 available funds of the Water Authority, if any, to finance the Refunding Project and to
5 pay Expenses relating to the issuance of the Bonds. The Bonds will have such
6 principal amounts, maturity dates and bear interest payable on the Interest Payment
7 Dates, as set forth in the Confirming Resolution. The Bonds shall bear interest from
8 the most recent date to which interest has been paid or provided for or if no interest
9 has been paid or provided for from the date of the Bonds until maturity or until
10 redeemed if called for redemption prior to maturity. Interest on Bonds will be
11 computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months. If,
12 upon presentation at maturity or for prior redemption, payment of the principal
13 amount of any Bond is not made as required by this Bond Ordinance, interest on the
14 unpaid principal amount of such Bond shall continue to accrue at the interest rate
15 stated or described in that Bond until the principal amount of that Bond is paid in full.
16 The maximum interest rate and maximum net effective interest rate on the Bonds
17 does not exceed 12% per annum, which are the maximum rates prescribed by the
18 laws of the State.

19 (2) Priority of Lien on the Net Revenues. The Series 2014A
20 Bonds shall be issued with a lien on the Net Revenues on a parity with the lien of the
21 Senior Obligations on the Net Revenues. The Series 2014B Bonds shall be issued
22 with a lien on the Net Revenues on a parity with the lien of the Subordinate
23 Obligations on the Net Revenues.

24 (C) BOOK-ENTRY. The Bonds shall be issued or registered in
25 book entry form with no physical distribution of bond certificates made to the public,
26 with a Depository acting as securities depository for the Bonds. A single certificate
27 for each maturity of the Bonds will be delivered to the Depository and immobilized in
28 its custody. The book-entry system will evidence ownership of the Bonds in
29 Authorized Denominations, with transfer of ownership effected on the books of the
30 Depository and its participants ("Participants"). As a condition to delivery of the
31 Bonds, the Purchasers will, immediately after acceptance of delivery thereof,

1 deposit, or cause to be deposited, Bond certificates with the Depository, registered
2 in the name of the Depository or its nominee. Principal of, premium, if any, and
3 interest on the Bonds will be paid to the Depository or its nominee as the registered
4 Owner of the Bonds. The transfer of principal and interest payments to Participants
5 will be the responsibility of the Depository; the transfer of principal and interest
6 payments to the beneficial owners of the Bonds (the "Beneficial Owners") will be the
7 responsibility of such Participants and other nominees of Beneficial Owners
8 maintaining a relationship with Participants (the "Indirect Participants"). The Water
9 Authority will not be responsible or liable for maintaining, supervising or reviewing
10 the records maintained by the Depository, Participants or Indirect Participants.

11 If (i) the Bonds are not eligible for the services of the Depository, (ii) the
12 Depository determines to discontinue providing its services or (iii) the Water
13 Authority determines that a continuation of the system of book-entry transfers
14 through the Depository ceases to be beneficial to the Water Authority or the
15 Beneficial Owners, the Water Authority will either identify another Depository or
16 certificates will be delivered to Beneficial Owners or their nominees and the
17 Beneficial Owners or their nominees, upon authentication of Bonds and registration
18 of the Bonds in the Beneficial Owners' or nominees' names, will become the Owners
19 for all purposes. In either such event, the Water Authority shall mail an appropriate
20 notice to the Depository for notification to Participants, Indirect Participants and
21 Beneficial Owners of the substitute Depository or the issuance of bond certificates to
22 Beneficial Owners or their nominees, as applicable.

23 Authorized Officers are authorized to sign agreements with Depositories
24 relating to the matters set forth in this Section.

25 Notwithstanding any other provision of the Bond Legislation to the contrary,
26 so long as all the Bonds are registered in the name of the Depository or its nominee,
27 all payments with respect to principal of, redemption premium, if any, and interest on
28 the Bonds, and all notices, shall be made and given by the Paying Agent or the
29 Water Authority to the Depository as provided in the Bond Legislation and by the
30 Depository to its Participants and by the Participants or Indirect Participants to the
31 Beneficial Owners.

1 (D) PAYMENT OF THE BONDS. The principal of and premium, if
2 any, on the Bonds shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds at
3 the principal office of the Paying Agent at or after their maturity or prior redemption
4 dates. Interest on the Bonds shall be payable by check or draft mailed to the owners
5 (or by such other arrangement as may be mutually agreed to by the Paying Agent
6 and an Owner). The Owner shall be deemed to be that person or entity shown on
7 the registration books for the Bonds maintained by the Registrar at the address
8 appearing in the registration books at the close of business on the applicable Record
9 Date. Interest which is not timely paid or provided for shall cease to be payable to
10 the Owner of the applicable Bonds (or of one or more predecessor Bonds) as of the
11 Record Date, but shall be payable to the Owners of those Bonds (or of one or more
12 predecessor Bonds) at the close of business on a special record date for the
13 payment of the overdue interest. The special record date shall be fixed by the
14 Paying Agent and Registrar whenever money becomes available for payment of the
15 overdue interest and notice of the special record date shall be given to the Owners
16 of the Bonds not less than ten days prior to that date. Payment shall be made in the
17 coin or currency of the United States of America that is at the time of payment legal
18 tender for the payment of public and private debts. If the principal amount of any
19 Bond presented for payment remains unpaid at maturity, the unpaid principal shall
20 bear interest at the rate designated in that Bond. Payments of Bonds shall be made
21 without deduction for exchange or collection charges.

22 The Water Authority shall transfer, or cause to be transferred, funds to the
23 Paying Agent on a timely basis so that the Paying Agent may make payments of the
24 principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds, when due, to the Owners
25 and comply with the requirements of any Credit Source. The Water Authority shall
26 notify the Paying Agent if there is or will be an insufficient amount of money of the
27 Water Authority legally available to pay principal and interest on the Bonds when
28 due.

29 Section 8. APPOINTMENT OF PAYING AGENT AND REGISTRAR. The
30 chief financial officer of the Water Authority is appointed as the initial Paying Agent
31 and Registrar. The Paying Agent, Authenticating Agent and Registrar shall be the

1 same person.

2 Section 9. REDEMPTION OF BONDS.

3 (A) GENERAL. The Bonds may be subject to optional and
4 mandatory sinking fund redemption, in whole or in part, upon the conditions, on the
5 dates and upon payment of the redemption prices set forth in the Confirming
6 Resolution.

7 (B) REDEMPTION CONDITIONAL. Unless money sufficient to pay
8 the principal of and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds to be redeemed at
9 the option of the Water Authority is received by the Paying Agent prior to the giving
10 of notice of redemption in accordance with Section 9.(E), that notice shall state that
11 the redemption is conditional upon the receipt of that money by the Paying Agent by
12 2:00 p.m. on the redemption date. If an amount sufficient to redeem all Bonds called
13 for redemption is not received by that time (i) the Paying Agent shall redeem only
14 those Bonds for which the redemption price was received and the Bonds to be
15 redeemed shall be selected in the manner set forth in Section 9.(D) and (ii) the
16 redemption notice shall have no effect with respect to those Bonds for which the
17 redemption price was not received and those Bonds shall not be redeemed. The
18 Registrar shall give notice to the Owners of the Bonds which will not be redeemed in
19 the manner in which the notice of redemption was given, identifying the Bonds which
20 will not be redeemed, stating that the redemption did not take place with respect to
21 those Bonds, and the Registrar shall promptly return those Bonds to the Owners
22 thereof as shown on the Bonds register.

23 (C) CANCELLATION AND CREDIT. At its option, to be exercised
24 on or before the 45th day next preceding any mandatory sinking fund redemption
25 date, the Water Authority may irrevocably elect to (a) deliver to the Paying Agent for
26 cancellation Bonds of the same series, interest rate and maturity in any aggregate
27 principal amount and/or (b) receive a credit in respect of its sinking fund redemption
28 obligation for any Bonds of the same series, interest rate and maturity which, prior to
29 said date, have been redeemed (otherwise than through the operation of the sinking
30 fund) and canceled by the Paying Agent and not theretofore applied as a credit
31 against any sinking fund redemption obligation. Each Bond delivered or previously

1 redeemed shall be credited by the Paying Agent as directed by the Water Authority
2 at the principal amount thereof in Authorized Denominations against the amounts
3 required to be paid by the Water Authority on the designated mandatory sinking fund
4 redemption date, and the principal amount of Bonds to be redeemed by operation of
5 such sinking fund on such date shall be reduced by that principal amount.

6 (D) PARTIAL REDEMPTION. If less than all of the Bonds subject
7 to redemption are to be redeemed at any one time, the Bonds to be redeemed shall
8 be selected by the Registrar in the manner and from the maturities designated by
9 the Water Authority. If less than all of the Bonds of a given maturity are redeemed,
10 the Bonds to be redeemed within that maturity shall be selected by lot in such
11 manner as determined by the Registrar. Part of a Bond may be redeemed in an
12 Authorized Denomination if the amount of that Bond which remains outstanding is
13 also in an Authorized Denomination.

14 (E) NOTICE OF REDEMPTION. Notice of redemption of Bonds
15 shall be given by the Registrar by sending a copy of such notice by Electronic
16 Means or by first-class, postage prepaid mail not less than 30 days prior to the
17 redemption date to the Owner of each Bond, or portion thereof, to be redeemed at
18 the address shown as of the fifth day prior to the mailing of notice on the registration
19 books kept by the Registrar and to the Credit Source for the Bonds, if any. The
20 Water Authority shall give the Registrar notice of Bonds to be called for optional
21 redemption at least fifteen (15) days prior to the date that the Registrar is required to
22 give Owners notice of redemption specifying the Bonds or the principal amount
23 thereof to be called for redemption and the applicable redemption date. If the Water
24 Authority has not designated the Bonds to be called for redemption on the dates
25 specified above, the Registrar shall select the Bonds to be redeemed by lot. Neither
26 the Water Authority's failure to give such notice, the Registrar's failure to give such
27 notice to the registered Owner of any Bonds or to any Credit Source, or any defect
28 thereon, nor the failure of the Depository to notify a Participant or any Participant or
29 Indirect Participant to notify a Beneficial Owner of any such redemption, shall affect
30 the validity of the proceedings for the redemption of any Bonds for which proper
31 notice was given.

1 Notices shall specify the numbers, CUSIP numbers and maturity date or
2 dates of the Bonds to be redeemed (if less than all Bonds are to be redeemed), the
3 date of or principal amounts of any Bonds to be redeemed in part, the date fixed for
4 redemption, and shall further state that, subject to the terms of Section 9.(B), if
5 applicable, on such redemption date there will become and be due and payable
6 upon each Bond or part thereof to be redeemed at the office of the Paying Agent the
7 principal amount thereof to be redeemed plus accrued interest, if any, to the
8 redemption date and the stipulated premium, if any, and that from and after such
9 date, interest will cease to accrue on those Bonds. In addition to the foregoing
10 notice, the notice of redemption given by the Registrar shall include such additional
11 information, and the Registrar shall comply with any other terms regarding
12 redemption, as are required by any applicable agreement with a Depository.

13 Notice having been given in the manner provided above, subject to the terms
14 of Section 9.(B), the Bonds or part thereof called for redemption shall become due
15 and payable on the redemption date designated and the Bonds or part thereof to be
16 redeemed, for which there was sufficient money on deposit with the Paying Agent,
17 shall not be deemed to be Outstanding and shall cease to bear or accrue interest
18 from and after such redemption date. Upon presentation of a Bond to be redeemed
19 at the office of the Paying Agent on or after the redemption date or, so long as the
20 book-entry system is used for determining beneficial ownership of Bonds, upon
21 satisfaction of the terms of any other arrangement between the Paying Agent and
22 the Depository, the Paying Agent will pay such Bond, or portion thereof called for
23 redemption.

24 The Registrar shall also send a copy of the notice of redemption by Electronic
25 Means, first class mail or overnight delivery to each Depository. Failure to provide
26 notice to any Depository shall not affect the validity of proceedings for the
27 redemption of Bonds.

28 The Water Authority is not required to notify the Registrar of mandatory
29 sinking fund redemption of Bonds.

30 (F) CANCELLATION. All Bonds which have been redeemed or
31 received for transfer shall be canceled and destroyed by the Paying Agent and shall

1 not be reissued and a counterpart of the certificate of destruction shall be furnished
2 by the Paying Agent to the Water Authority.

3 Section 10. REGISTRATION, TRANSFER, EXCHANGE AND OWNERSHIP
4 OF BONDS.

5 (A) REGISTRATION AND EXCHANGE. The Water Authority shall
6 cause books for registration, transfer and exchange of the Bonds to be kept at the
7 principal office of the Registrar. Upon surrender for transfer or exchange of any
8 Bonds at the principal office of the Registrar duly endorsed by the Owner or his
9 attorney duly authorized in writing, or accompanied by a written instrument or
10 instruments of transfer or exchange in form satisfactory to the Registrar and properly
11 executed, the Water Authority shall execute and the Registrar shall authenticate and
12 deliver in the name of the transferee or Owner replacement Bonds of the same
13 maturity, interest rate and aggregate principal amount in Authorized Denominations.

14 (B) OWNERS OF BONDS. The person in whose name any Bond is
15 registered shall be deemed and regarded as its absolute Owner for all purposes,
16 except as may otherwise be provided with respect to the payment of overdue
17 interest on the Bonds in Section 7.(D). Payment of either the principal of or interest
18 on any Bond shall be made only to or upon the order of its Owner or his legal
19 representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and
20 discharge the liability on Bonds to the extent of the amount paid.

21 (C) LOST BONDS. If any Bond is lost, stolen, destroyed or
22 mutilated, the Registrar shall, upon receipt of that certificate, if mutilated, and the
23 evidence, information or indemnity which the Registrar may reasonably require, if
24 lost, stolen, or destroyed, authenticate and deliver a replacement Bond of the same
25 aggregate principal amount, maturity and interest rate, bearing a number or numbers
26 not then outstanding. If any lost, stolen, destroyed or mutilated Bond has matured or
27 been called for redemption, the Registrar may direct the Paying Agent to pay that
28 Bond in lieu of replacement.

29 (D) CHARGES TO OWNERS. Exchanges and transfers of Bonds
30 shall be made without charge to the Owner or any transferee except that the
31 Registrar may make a charge sufficient to reimburse the Registrar for any tax, fee or

1 other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to that transfer or
2 exchange.

3 (E) LIMITATIONS ON TRANSFER. Except for any Bond which
4 may be and is tendered for purchase, the Registrar shall not be required to transfer

17 Bond the printed, engraved, stamped or otherwise placed facsimile or imprint of the
18 Water Authority's corporate seal. Bonds when authenticated and bearing the
19 manual or facsimile signatures of the officers in office at the time of their signing
20 shall be valid and binding obligations of the Water Authority, notwithstanding that
21 before delivery of those Bonds, any or all of the persons who executed those Bonds
22 shall have ceased to fill their respective offices. The Chair, Vice Chair, Executive
23 Director and Board Secretary, at the time of the execution of the Bonds and the
24 signature certificate, each may adopt as and for his or her own facsimile signature,
25 the facsimile signature of his or her predecessor in office if such facsimile signature
26 appears upon any of the Bonds or certificates pertaining to the Bonds. No manual
27 or facsimile signature of an officer of the Water Authority or an Authenticating Agent
28 shall be required if the Bonds are issued in book-entry form without the delivery of
29 any physical securities.

30 (B) CUSTODY. The Authenticating Agent or its designee shall hold
31 in custody all Bonds signed and attested by the Chair, Vice Chair and Executive

1 Director or Board Secretary until ready for delivery to the Purchaser, transferee or
2 Owner. The Water Authority shall, from time to time, at the written request of the
3 Authenticating Agent, provide the Authenticating Agent an adequate supply of
4 Bonds.

5 (C) AUTHENTICATION. No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for
6 any purpose unless the certificate of authentication has been duly executed by the
7 Authenticating Agent. The Authenticating Agent's certificate of authentication shall
8 be deemed to have been duly executed if manually signed by an Authorized Officer
9 of the Authenticating Agent, but it shall not be necessary that the same officer sign
10 the certificate of authentication on all Bonds.

11 Section 13. NEGOTIABILITY; PREFERENCE. Except as otherwise stated
12 in this Bond Ordinance, Bonds shall be fully negotiable and shall have all the
13 qualities of negotiable paper and the Owners shall possess all rights enjoyed by the
14 holders of negotiable instruments under the provisions of the State's Uniform
15 Commercial Code -- Investment Securities. All Bonds shall in all respects, as to
16 each other, be equally and ratably secure, without preference, priority or distinction
17 on account of the dates or the actual times of their issuance or maturities.

28 of, premium, if any, or interest on such obligations or such fees, costs and expenses,
29 except the designated special funds specifically pledged for the Bonds as set forth in
30 or permitted by this Section. Neither the Bonds, the Bond Legislation, the
31 Continuing Disclosure Undertaking, the Escrow Agreement or any Credit Facility nor

1 such costs, fees and expenses of the Water Authority shall constitute an
2 indebtedness of the Water Authority within the meaning of any constitutional, charter
3 or statutory provision or limitation, nor shall they be considered or held to be general
4 obligations of the Water Authority, and each Bond shall recite that it is payable and
5 collectible solely from the Net Revenues, the proceeds of the Bonds, and, if a Bond
6 Insurance Policy is issued for the payment of the Bonds, from the proceeds of that
7 policy and that the Owners may not look to any general funds of the Water Authority
8 or any City or County fund for the payment of the principal of, premium, if any, or
9 interest on the Bonds.

10 Section 15. SALE OF BONDS. The Bonds shall be sold in accordance with
11 the Bond Purchase Agreement in a negotiated sale to the Purchaser. The Bonds
12 shall be sold at an underwriter's discount, including expenses and fees of the
13 Purchaser, not to exceed 0.75% of the total original principal amount of the Bonds
14 as set forth in the Bond Purchase Agreement. After the Bonds have been duly
15 executed and authenticated and upon receipt of the purchase price therefor, the
16 Bonds shall be delivered to the Purchaser by an Authorized Officer in accordance
17 with the Bond Purchase Agreement.

18 Section 16. FORM OF BONDS. The form of the Bonds shall be

27 Fund Loan Agreement (2005) maturing on and after May 1, 2016, (ii) the Series
28 2005 Bonds maturing on and after July 1, 2016, and (iii) the Series 2006A Bonds
29 maturing on and after July 1, 2017 to be maintained by the Escrow Agent pursuant
30 to the Escrow Agreement.

31 Section 21. ADMINISTRATION OF JOINT WATER AND SEWER FUND.

1 (A) USE OF GROSS REVENUES. As long as any Bonds are
2 outstanding, all Gross Revenues shall continue to be deposited in the Joint Water
3 and Sewer Fund and transferred from that fund to the following funds and accounts
4 or for payment of the following amounts in the order listed:

5 (1) Operation And Maintenance Expenses. A sufficient
6 amount of Gross Revenues shall be set aside each month to be used to pay the
7 current Operation and Maintenance Expenses as they become due.

8 (2) Debt Service Accounts for Senior Obligations. Net
9 Revenues shall be transferred to the Debt Service Accounts established for Senior
10 Obligations to pay Debt Service Requirements on Senior Obligations, as they
11 become due, including amounts owed to any Credit Source to reimburse that Credit
12 Source for the payments of Debt Service Requirements on Senior Obligations.

13 (3) Reserve Accounts for Senior Obligations. Net Revenues
14 shall be transferred to a Reserve Account, if any, to the extent that amounts on
15 deposit in that Reserve Account are less than the amount (including coverage
16 available under any applicable Reserve Account Surety Bond) required to be on
17 deposit therein. The Net Revenues deposited shall be used first to reimburse the
18 Credit Source for the proceeds of a Reserve Account Surety Bond used to pay Debt
19 Service Requirements, second to replace money drawn from the Reserve Account
20 and third to pay the Credit Source interest accrued and owed on amounts advanced
21 pursuant to the Reserve Account Surety Bond.

22 (4) Debt Service Accounts For Subordinate Obligations. Net
23 Revenues shall be transferred to the Debt Service Accounts established for
24 Subordinate Obligations to pay Debt Service Requirements on Subordinate
25 Obligations, as they become due, including amounts owed to any Credit Source to
26 reimburse that Credit Source for the payments of Debt Service Requirements on
27 Subordinate Obligations.

28 (5) Reserve Accounts for Subordinate Obligations. Net
29 Revenues shall be transferred to a Reserve Account, if any, to the extent that
30 amounts on deposit in that Reserve Account are less than the amount (including
31 coverage available under any applicable Reserve Account Surety Bond) required to

1 be on deposit therein. The Net Revenues deposited shall be used first to reimburse
2 the Credit Source for the proceeds of a Reserve Account Surety Bond used to pay
3 Debt Service Requirements, second to replace money drawn from the Reserve
4 Account and third to pay to the Credit Source interest accrued and owed on amounts
5 advanced pursuant to the Reserve Account Surety Bond.

6 (6) Super Subordinated Obligations. Net Revenues shall be
7 used to pay Debt Service Requirements on Super Subordinated Obligations, and to
8 fund any Reserve Requirement for Super Subordinated Obligations.

9 (7) Rate Stabilization Fund. At the option of the Water
10 Authority, Net Revenues may be transferred to the Rate Stabilization Fund to be
11 used for the purposes stated in Section 21.(G).

12 (8) Surplus Net Revenues. Surplus Net Revenues shall be
13 retained in the Joint Water and Sewer Fund or used for any other lawful System
14 purpose including, but not limited to, redeeming or purchasing System Obligations or
15 paying costs and expenses of the Water Authority relating to the administration of
16 System Obligations.

17 (9) Accumulation Of Revenues. Net Revenues need not be
18 retained for any use or in any fund or account described in this paragraph A in
19 excess of the Net Revenues required for any current use or deposit. For the
20 purposes of this subparagraph, the term current shall mean the month during which
21 the Net Revenues are being distributed and the immediately following month.

22 (B) SERIES 2014A BONDS DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. Net
23 Revenues shall be transferred to the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account
24 sufficient to pay when due the Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014A
25 Bonds.

26 (1) Except as stated in this Section 21.(B)(1) and in Section
27 21.(F), substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues shall be made to the
28 Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account beginning six months before each
29 Interest Payment Date in order to make the next payment of interest on the Series
30 2014A Bonds when due. However, if the first Interest Payment Date for the Bonds is
31 less than six months after the date of the original issuance of the Series 2014A

1 Bonds, substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues before the first Interest
2 Payment Date shall begin in the first full month following the date of issuance of the
3 Bonds in order to make the first payment of interest on the Bonds when due.

4 (2) Except as stated in this Section 21.(B)(2) and in Section
5 21.(F), substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues shall be made to the
6 Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account beginning 12 months before each
7 principal payment date for the Series 2014A Bonds payable from such account in
8 order to make the next scheduled payment of principal on the Series 2014A Bonds
9 when due at maturity. However, if the first principal payment date for the Series
10 2014A Bonds is less than thirteen months after the date of the original issuance of
11 the Series 2014A Bonds, substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues
12 before the first principal payment date shall begin in the first full month following the
13 date of issuance of the Series 2014A Bonds in order to make the first payment of
14 principal on the Series 2014A Bonds when due at maturity.

15 If in the month immediately preceding any payment date for the Series 2014A
16 Bonds, the Water Authority determines that there are not sufficient funds
17 accumulated in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account to pay the amount
18 becoming due on that payment date, the Water Authority shall promptly deposit any
19 available Net Revenues in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account in an
20 amount equal to the deficiency. If, prior to any payment date for the Series 2014A
21 Bonds, there has accumulated in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account the
22 entire amount necessary to pay the amount becoming due on the Series 2014A
23 Bonds payable from such account on that payment date, no additional Net
24 Revenues need be deposited in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account prior
25 to that payment date. In making the determinations permitted by this paragraph, the
26 Water Authority may take into account the amount on deposit in any other fund or
27 account or escrow relating to the Series 2014A Bonds irrevocably set aside for the
28 next payment of the Series 2014A Bonds.

29 Amounts on deposit in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account shall
30 be applied first to the payment of interest and then to pay or satisfy any payment of
31 principal. Except as provided in Section 21.(F), money in the Series 2014A Bonds

1 Debt Service Account shall be used only to pay the Debt Service Requirements on
2 the Series 2014A Bonds. Transfers of amounts equal to the periodic Debt Service
3 Requirements on the Series 2014A Bonds shall be made by the Water Authority on
4 a timely basis to the Paying Agent.

5 (C) RESERVE ACCOUNT FOR SERIES 2014A BONDS. The
6 Water Authority may establish a Reserve Account for the Series 2014A Bonds and
7 administer such account as provided in the Confirming Resolution.

8 (D) SERIES 2014B BONDS DEBT SERVICE ACCOUNT. Net
9 Revenues shall be transferred to the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account
10 sufficient to pay when due the Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014B
11 Bonds.

12 (1) Except as stated in this Section 21.(D)(1) and in Section
13 21.(F), substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues shall be made to the
14 Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account beginning six months before each
15 Interest Payment Date in order to make the next payment of interest on the Series
16 2014B Bonds when due. However, if the first Interest Payment Date for the Bonds is
17 less than six months after the date of the original issuance of the Series 2014B
18 Bonds, substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues before the first Interest
19 Payment Date shall begin in the first full month following the date of issuance of the
20 Bonds in order to make the first payment of interest on the Bonds when due.

21
22 (2) Except as stated in this Section 21.(D)(2) and in Section
23 21.(F), substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues shall be made to the
24 Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account beginning 12 months before each
25 principal payment date for the Series 2014B Bonds payable from such account in
26 order to make the next scheduled payment of principal on the Series 2014B Bonds
27 when due at maturity. However, if the first principal payment date for the Series
28 2014B Bonds is less than thirteen months after the date of the original issuance of
29 the Series 2014B Bonds, substantially equal monthly deposits of Net Revenues
30 before the first principal payment date shall begin in the first full month following the
31 date of issuance of the Series 2014B Bonds in order to make the first payment of

1 principal on the Series 2014B Bonds when due at maturity.

2 If in the month immediately preceding any payment date for the Series 2014B
3 Bonds, the Water Authority determines that there are not sufficient funds
4 accumulated in the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account to pay the amount
5 becoming due on that payment date, the Water Authority shall promptly deposit any
6 available Net Revenues in the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account in an
7 amount equal to the deficiency. If, prior to any payment date for the Series 2014B
8 Bonds, there has accumulated in the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account the
9 entire amount necessary to pay the amount becoming due on the Series 2014B
10 Bonds payable from such account on that payment date, no additional Net
11 Revenues need be deposited in the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account prior
12 to that payment date. In making the determinations permitted by this paragraph, the
13 Water Authority may take into account the amount on deposit in any other fund or
14 account or escrow relating to the Series 2014B Bonds irrevocably set aside for the
15 next payment of the Series 2014B Bonds.

16 (3) Amounts on deposit in the Series 2014B Bonds
17 Debt Service Account shall be applied first to the payment of interest and then to pay
18 or satisfy any payment of principal. Except as provided in Section 21.(F), money in
19 the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account shall be used only to pay the Debt
20 Service Requirements on the Series 2014B Bonds. Transfers of amounts equal to
21 the periodic Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014B Bonds shall be made
22 by the Water Authority on a timely basis to the Paying Agent.

23 (E) RESERVE ACCOUNT FOR 2014B BONDS. The Water
24 Authority may establish a Reserve Account for the Series 2014B Bonds and
25 administer such account as provided in the Confirming Resolution.

26 (F) TERMINATION UPON DEPOSITS RELATING TO THE BONDS
27 TO MATURITY. No payments need be made into the Series 2014A Bonds Debt
28 Service Account if the amount in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account is
29 no less than the Debt Service Requirements due and to become due on and before
30 the final maturity date of the Series 2014A Bonds, both accrued and not accrued,
31 and all proceeds paid under any Credit Facility for the Series 2014A Bonds have

1 been reimbursed. The money retained in that account shall be used only to pay the
2 Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014A Bonds when due except that any
3 money on deposit in the Series 2014A Bonds Debt Service Account which is not
4 necessary to pay such Debt Service Requirements shall be used as surplus Net
5 Revenues.

6 No payments need be made into the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service
7 Account if the amount in the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account is no less
8 than the Debt Service Requirements due and to become due on and before the final
9 maturity date of the Series 2014B Bonds, both accrued and not accrued, and all
10 proceeds paid under any Credit Facility for the Series 2014B Bonds have been
11 reimbursed. The money retained in that account shall be used only to pay the Debt
12 Service Requirements on the Series 2014B Bonds when due except that any money
13 on deposit in the Series 2014B Bonds Debt Service Account which is not necessary
14 to pay such Debt Service Requirements shall be used as surplus Net Revenues.

15 (G) RATE STABILIZATION FUND. Money on deposit in the Rate
16 Stabilization Fund may be withdrawn at any time and used for any purpose for which
17 Gross Revenues may be used.

18 (H) PRO RATA DEPOSITS. If the amount of Net Revenues
19 available for deposit in the Debt Service Fund is not sufficient to pay the entire
20 amount required to be deposited in the Debt Service Accounts and/or Reserve
21 Accounts for System Obligations, the Net Revenues available shall be deposited in
22 the Debt Service Accounts and Reserve Accounts pro rata based upon the amount
23 required to be deposited in each account to the total Net Revenues available for
24 deposit but with the priorities established in Section 21.(A).

25 With respect to each applicable series of System Obligations,
26 reimbursements owed to a Credit Source for amounts used to pay Debt Service
27 Requirements on those System Obligations shall be paid on the same pro rata basis
28 and with the same priority as are amounts to be deposited in the Debt Service
29 Account or Reserve Account, as applicable, for those System Obligations; provided
30 that such reimbursements for payments of Debt Service Requirements made

1 pursuant to a Credit Facility pursuant to Sections 21.(C) and (D) shall be made with
2 the priorities set forth in those paragraphs.

3 (I) VARIABLE RATE OBLIGATIONS. In making computations
4 required by this Section, interest on Variable Rate Obligations which cannot be
5 computed exactly shall be deemed to bear the interest rate required by the definition
6 of Debt Service Requirements in this Bond Ordinance. To determine the amount
7 required to be on deposit in any Debt Service Account for the payment of interest,
8 computations of the interest rate on Variable Rate Obligations shall be made
9 whenever there is a change in the interest rate on the applicable Variable Rate
10 Obligations except that the computation need not be made more often than once in
11 any month.

12 Section 22. TRANSFERS TO PAY PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM, IF ANY,
13 AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS; PAYMENT OF EXPENSES.

14 (A) TRANSFER TO PAYING AGENT. The Water Authority shall
15 transfer the funds set aside pursuant to Section 21 for the payments of principal of,
16 premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds to the Paying Agent on or before the date
17 on which each such payment is due.

18 (B) EXPENSES. The Water Authority or its designee shall pay, or
19 cause to be paid, all Expenses directly to the party entitled thereto.

20 Section 23. GENERAL ADMINISTRATION OF FUNDS. The funds and
21 accounts designated in Sections 20 and 21 shall be administered as follows:

22 (A) INVESTMENT OF MONEY. To the extent practicable, any
23 money in any such fund or account shall be invested in Permitted Investments,
24 provided however that money in the Escrow Funds shall be invested only as
25 provided in the Escrow Agreement. Obligations purchased as an investment of
26 money in any fund or account shall be deemed at all times to be part of that fund or
27 account, and the interest accruing and any profit realized on those Investments shall
28 be credited to that fund or account, unless otherwise stated in the Bond Legislation
29 or related document (subject to withdrawal at any time for the uses directed and
30 permitted for such money by the Bond Legislation and related documents), and any
31 loss resulting from such investment shall be charged to that fund or account. The

1 custodian for any such fund or account shall present for redemption or sale on the
2 prevailing market any Permitted Investment in a fund or account when necessary to
3 provide money to meet a required payment or when required to be transferred from
4 that fund or account.

5 (B) DEPOSITS OF FUNDS. The money and investments which are
6 part of the funds and accounts designated in Sections 20 and 21 shall be maintained
7 and kept in an Insured Bank or Banks, or otherwise in Permitted Investments or may
8 be held in book-entry form in the name of the Water Authority by an agent or
9 custodian of or for the Water Authority for the benefit of the Water Authority, as
10 permitted by State law and the money and investments deposited in the Escrow
11 Funds shall be held by the Escrow Agent. Each payment or deposit shall be made
12 into and credited to the proper fund or account at the designated time, except that
13 when the designated time is not a Business Day, then the payment shall be made on
14 the next succeeding Business Day unless otherwise required in this Bond Ordinance
15 or related documents. The Water Authority may establish one or more accounts in
16 Insured Banks for all of the funds and accounts or combine such funds and accounts
17 with any other Insured Bank account or accounts for other funds and accounts of the
18 Water Authority.

19 (C) VALUATION OF INVESTMENTS. In the computation of the
20 amount in any account or fund for any purpose under this Bond Ordinance, except
21 as otherwise expressly provided in this Bond Ordinance, Permitted Investments
22 shall be valued at the cost thereof (including any amount paid as accrued interest) or
23 the principal amount thereof, whichever is less; except that Permitted Investments
24 purchased at a premium may initially may be valued at the cost thereof, but in each
25 year after such purchase shall be valued at a lesser amount determined by ratably
26 amortizing the premium over the remaining term. Bank deposits shall be valued at
27 the amount deposited, exclusive of any accrued interest or any other gain to the
28 Water Authority until such gain is realized by the receipt of an interest-earned notice,
29 or otherwise. The valuation of Permitted Investments and bank deposits in any
30 account shall be made not less frequently than annually. Unless otherwise required
31 by accounting standards applicable to the Water Authority, no loss or profit on

1 Permitted Investments shall be deemed to take place as a result of fluctuation in the
2 market quotations prior to the sale or maturity thereof.

3 Section 24. CREDIT FACILITY.

4 (A) CREDIT FACILITY FOR PAYMENT OF THE BONDS.

5 Payments of all or any part of the principal of and interest on the Bonds may be
6 guaranteed by a Credit Source as and to the extent set forth in the Confirming
7 Resolution.

8 (B) CHANGES TO INSURANCE TERMS. Terms and provisions

9 with respect to any Credit Facility for the Bonds, in addition to those set forth in the
10 Bond Legislation, shall be as set forth in the Credit Facility.

11 (C) CONSENT OF CREDIT SOURCE. Any provision of this Bond

12 Ordinance expressly recognizing or granting rights in or to a Credit Source may not
13 be amended in any manner which affects the rights of the Credit Source without the
14 prior written consent of that Credit Source.

15 (D) ADVERSE EFFECT ON OWNERS. In determining whether the

16 rights of the Owners will be adversely affected by any action taken pursuant to the
17 terms and provisions of this Bond Ordinance, the Water Authority shall consider the
18 effect on the Owners as if there were no Bond Insurance Policy or Reserve Account
19 Surety Bond in effect.

20 (E) CREDIT FACILITY. The rights and obligations of any Credit

21 Source under any Credit Facility shall be as set forth in the Bond Legislation or the
22 Credit Facility but shall not exceed any of the limitations included in the Bond
23 Legislation. The Water Authority shall promptly notify any rating agency then rating
24 the Bonds of changes to the terms of a Credit Facility.

25 Section 25. PLEDGE OF NET REVENUES AND LIEN OF THE BONDS.

26 The Net Revenues are hereby pledged for the payment of the Series 2014A Bonds,
27 the reimbursement of obligations of the Water Authority for the proceeds of any
28 Credit Facility used to pay Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014A Bonds
29 and for the other payment obligations of the Water Authority set forth in the Bond
30 Legislation, and such payments and obligations of the Water Authority shall continue
31 to have an irrevocable senior lien (but not an exclusive senior lien) upon the Net

1 Revenues, on a parity with the Outstanding Senior Obligations until paid. Net
2 Revenues shall be applied to the payment of such payments and obligations with the
3 priorities set forth in Section 21.(A).

4 The Net Revenues are hereby pledged for the payment of the Series 2014B
5 Bonds, the reimbursement of obligations of the Water Authority for the proceeds of
6 any Credit Facility used to pay Debt Service Requirements on the Series 2014B
7 Bonds and for the other payment obligations of the Water Authority set forth in the
8 Bond Legislation, and such payments and obligations of the Water Authority shall
9 continue to have an irrevocable subordinate lien (but not an exclusive subordinate
10 lien) upon the Net Revenues, on a parity with the Outstanding Subordinate
11 Obligations until paid. Net Revenues shall be applied to the payment of such
12 payments and obligations with the priorities set forth in Section 21.(A).

13 Section 26. ESTABLISHMENT OF PRIORITIES OF THE BONDS. Except
14 as set forth in the Bond Legislation, the Series 2014A Bonds from time to time
15 Outstanding shall not be entitled to any priority one over the other in the application
16 of the Net Revenues, regardless of the time or times of their issuance. Except as
17 set forth in the Bond Legislation, the Series 2014B Bonds from time to time
18 Outstanding shall not be entitled to any priority one over the other in the application
19 of the Net Revenues, regardless of their times of issuance.

20 Section 27. ADDITIONAL SYSTEM OBLIGATIONS.

21 (A) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF SYSTEM OBLIGATIONS.
22 Subject to the limitations of this Section and Section 28, nothing in this Bond
23 Ordinance shall be construed to prevent the issuance by the Water Authority of
24 additional System Obligations.

25 (B) ADDITIONAL PARITY SENIOR OBLIGATIONS. The tests
26 required in this Section 27.(B) shall be performed without adjustment for payments
27 to or withdrawals from the Rate Stabilization Fund or interest accrued in the
28 Acquisition Fund. Except as permitted by Section 28, prior to the issuance of
29 additional Senior Obligations, the Water Authority shall be current in making all
30 deposits required by Section 21 and the following test shall be satisfied:

31 (1) The Net Revenues for the Historic Test Period shall have

1 been sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 133% of the maximum
2 combined annual Debt Service Requirements of only the Outstanding Senior
3 Obligations and the terms of either subparagraph 2(a) or 2(b) shall be satisfied.

4 (2) (a) Using the fees and rates for use of the System on
5 the date of computation, or assuming that any new schedule of fees and rates
6 approved by the Water Authority during or after the Historic Test Period was in effect
7 during the entire Historic Test Period, the Net Revenues which were or would have
8 been received during that Historic Test Period shall have been sufficient to pay an
9 amount representing at least 133% of the maximum combined annual Debt Service
10 Requirement on the Outstanding Senior Obligations and the Senior Obligations
11 proposed to be issued; or

12 (b) The projected Net Revenues for the Prospective
13 Test Period shall be sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 133% of the
14 maximum combined annual Debt Service Requirements on the Outstanding Senior
15 Obligations and Senior Obligations proposed to be issued. To determine if the
16 annual Net Revenues are sufficient for the purposes of the preceding sentence, the
17 Net Revenues projected for the applicable Prospective Test Period shall be
18 determined by applying the rates for use of the System approved by the Board at the
19 time of computation to be in effect during the Prospective Test Period to the
20 proposed number of connections to the System after giving effect to the purchase,
21 expansion or improvement of the System or the acquisition of an existing water and
22 sanitary sewer system.

23 (C) ADDITIONAL PARITY SUBORDINATE OBLIGATIONS. The
24 tests required in this Section 27.(C) shall be performed without adjustment for
25 payments to or withdrawals from the Rate Stabilization Fund or interest accrued in
26 the Acquisition Fund. So long as the 2005 Bonds, 2006A Bonds, 2008A Bonds,
27 2009 Bonds, 2013A&B Bonds, Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan
28 Agreement (2003), Public Project Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2005), Public
29 Project Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2007), Drinking Water State Revolving
30 Fund Loan (2009), and Public Project Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2011) are
31 Outstanding, the Water Authority shall be required to meet all three tests established

1 in this paragraph; after those Senior Obligations listed are no longer Outstanding,
2 the Water Authority shall be required to only meet the tests set forth in (i) and (iii) of
3 the following sentence, and the test set forth in (ii) of the following sentence shall
4 have no further force or effect. Except as permitted by Section 28, prior to the
5 issuance of additional Subordinate Obligations, the Water Authority (i) shall be
6 current in making all deposits required by Section 21, (ii) shall satisfy the test set
7 forth in paragraph (B) of this Section 27 related to the issuance of additional Senior
8 Obligations, and (iii) shall satisfy the following test:

9 (1) The Net Revenues for the Historic Test Period shall have
10 been sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 120% of the maximum
11 combined annual Debt Service Requirements of only the Outstanding Senior
12 Obligations and the Outstanding Subordinate Obligations and the terms of either
13 subparagraph 2(a) or 2(b) shall be satisfied.

14 (2) (a) Using the fees and rates for use of the System on
15 the date of computation, or assuming that any new schedule of fees and rates
16 approved by the Water Authority during or after the Historic Test Period was in effect
17 during the entire Historic Test Period, the Net Revenues which were or would have
18 been received during that Historic Test Period shall have been sufficient to pay an
19 amount representing at least 120% of the maximum combined annual Debt Service
20 Requirement on the Outstanding Senior Obligations and Outstanding Subordinate
21 Obligations and the Subordinate Obligations proposed to be issued; or

22 (b) The projected Net Revenues for the Prospective
23 Test Period shall be sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 120% of the
24 maximum combined annual Debt Service Requirements on the Outstanding Senior
25 Obligations and Outstanding Subordinate Obligations and the Subordinate
26 Obligations proposed to be issued. To determine if the annual Net Revenues are
27 sufficient for the purposes of the preceding sentence, the Net Revenues projected
28 for the applicable Prospective Test Period shall be determined by applying the rates
29 for use of the System approved by the Board at the time of computation to be in
30 effect during the Prospective Test Period to the proposed number of connections to
31 the System after giving effect to the purchase, expansion or improvement of the

1 System or the acquisition of an existing water and sanitary sewer system.

2 (D) CERTIFICATES. In determining whether additional Senior
3 Obligations may be issued pursuant to Section 27.(B) or additional Subordinate
4 Obligations may be issued pursuant to Section 27.(C), a written certificate or opinion
5 of an Independent Accountant that states in substance that the Net Revenues are
6 sufficient to pay the amounts required shall be conclusively presumed to be accurate
7 in determining the right of the Water Authority to authorize, issue, sell and deliver
8 such Additional Senior Obligations or additional Subordinate Obligations,
9 respectively. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if all Senior Obligations issued prior to
10 August 18, 2004 are no longer Outstanding, then such a certificate or opinion from
11 an Authorized Officer will satisfy the foregoing requirement. Also, an opinion of a
12 Consulting Engineer as to the estimated completion date of the Project to be
13 financed by the proposed System Obligations and the estimated Net Revenues for
14 the Prospective Test Period referred to in Section 27.(B)(2)(b) and Section
15 27.(C)(2)(b) shall be conclusively presumed to be accurate, and the Independent
16 Accountant or Authorized Officer, as the case may be, may conclusively rely upon
17 the written opinion of the Consulting Engineer in making the determinations required
18 by Section 27.(B) and Section 27.(C).

19 (E) SUPER SUBORDINATED OBLIGATIONS PERMITTED. No
20 provision of this Bond Ordinance shall be construed to prevent the Water Authority
21 from issuing additional Super Subordinated Obligations with a lien on Net Revenues
22 subordinate to the lien of the Subordinate Obligations and the Senior Obligations.

23 (F) VARIABLE RATE OBLIGATIONS. In making the computations
24 required by this Section to determine if additional System Obligations may be
25 issued, Variable Rate Obligations shall be deemed to bear rate of interest as
26 required in the definition of Debt Service Requirements.

27 Section 28. REFUNDING OBLIGATIONS. The provisions of Section 27 of
28 this Bond Ordinance are subject to the following exceptions:

29 (A) PRIVILEGE OF ISSUING REFUNDING OBLIGATIONS. If at
30 any time while System Obligations remain Outstanding, the Water Authority desires
31 to refund any Outstanding System Obligations or other obligations payable from Net

1 Revenues, those System Obligations or other obligations, or any part thereof, may
2 be refunded regardless of whether the priority of the lien for the payment of the
3 refunding System Obligations on the Net Revenues is changed (except as provided
4 in paragraphs B and C of this Section).

5 (B) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING SENIOR
6 OBLIGATIONS. No senior refunding bonds or other senior refunding obligations
7 shall be issued as Senior Obligations unless:

8 (1) The refunding does not increase the maximum combined
9 annual Debt Service Requirements of the Senior Obligations, or

10 (2) The refunding Senior Obligations are issued in
11 compliance with Section 27(B).

12 (C) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING
13 SUBORDINATE OBLIGATIONS. No subordinate refunding bonds or other
14 subordinate refunding obligations shall be issued as Subordinate Obligations unless:

15 (1) The refunding does not increase the maximum combined
16 annual Debt Service Requirements of the Subordinate Obligations, or

17 (2) The refunding Subordinate Obligations are issued in
18 compliance with Section 27.(C).

19 (D) LIMITATIONS UPON ISSUANCE OF ANY REFUNDING
20 SYSTEM OBLIGATIONS. Any refunding System Obligations shall be issued with
21 such details as the Board may provide by appropriate proceedings but without
22 impairment of any contractual obligation imposed upon the Water Authority by any
23 proceedings authorizing the issuance of any unrefunded portion of the series of
24 System Obligations to which the refunding was applicable.

25 Section 29. PROTECTIVE COVENANTS. The Water Authority hereby
26 covenants and agrees with the Owners:

27 (A) USE OF THE BOND PROCEEDS. The Water Authority will
28 promptly apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the Refunding Project and for the other
29 purposes permitted by this Bond Ordinance.

30 (B) PAYMENT OF THE BONDS. The Water Authority will promptly
31 pay the Debt Service Requirements on the Bonds at the place, on the dates and in

1 the manner specified in this Bond Ordinance and the Bonds.

2 (C) RATE COVENANTS.

3 (1) Rate Covenant for Series 2014A Bonds. The Water
4 Authority will charge all purchasers of services of the System, including the Water
5 Authority, the City and the County, such reasonable and just rates as are sufficient
6 to produce Net Revenues annually to pay 133% of the annual Debt Service
7 Requirements on the Outstanding Senior Obligations (excluding accumulation of any
8 reserves therefor).

9 (2) Clarification of Rate Covenants on Outstanding Senior
10 Obligations. The Rate Covenants contained in the legislation authorizing the
11 issuance of the Outstanding Senior Obligations are hereby clarified to provide that
12 the Water Authority will charge all purchasers of services of the System, including
13 the Water Authority, the City and the county, such reasonable and just rates as are
14 sufficient to produce Net Revenues annually to pay 133% of the annual Debt Service
15 Requirements on the Outstanding Senior Obligations (excluding accumulation of any
16 reserves therefor).

17 (3) Rate Covenant for Series 2014B Bonds. The Water
18 Authority will charge all purchasers of services of the System, including the Water
19 Authority, the City and the County, such reasonable and just rates as are sufficient
20 to produce Net Revenues annually to pay 120% of the annual Debt Service
21 Requirements on the Outstanding Senior Obligations and the Outstanding
22 Subordinate Obligations (excluding accumulation of any reserves therefor).

23 (4) Quarterly, the Water Authority shall determine that the
24 Net Revenues are sufficient to satisfy the Rate Covenants. If the Net Revenues are
25 not sufficient to satisfy the Rate Covenant upon the approval of the annual audit for
26 a Fiscal Year, the Water Authority will either: (i) promptly increase the rates for use
27 of the Services of the System in order to generate sufficient Net Revenues to satisfy
28 the Rate Covenants or (ii) employ a consultant or manager for the System who shall
29 have a favorable national reputation for skill and experience in the management,
30 operation and financial affairs of water and sanitary sewer systems and who is not
31 an employee or officer of the Water Authority. The Water Authority will request that

1 consultant or manager to make its recommendations, if any, as to revisions of the
2 Water Authority's rate structure and other charges for use of the System, its
3 Operation and Maintenance Expenses and the method of operation of the System in
4 order to satisfy the Rate Covenants as soon as practicable. Copies of any such
5 requests and recommendations of the consultant or manager shall be filed with the
6 Board. So long as the Water Authority substantially complies with the
7 recommendations of the consultant or manager on a timely basis, the Water
8 Authority will not be deemed to have defaulted in satisfying the Rate Covenants
9 even if the resulting Net Revenues are not sufficient to be in compliance with the
10 Rate Covenants, if there is no other default under this Bond Ordinance.

11 (5) No free service, facilities or commodities shall be
12 furnished by the System. If the Water Authority, the City or the County elects to use
13 water supplied by, or the sanitary sewer facilities of, the System or in any other
14 manner use the System, such use of the System by such entity shall be paid from
15 lawfully available money of such entity at the reasonable value of the use made,
16 service rendered or facility or commodity supplied as is charged to other similar
17 users of the System.

18 (6) Nothing contained in this paragraph C shall be
19 interpreted to require the Water Authority to take any action in violation of any
20 applicable requirement imposed by law.

21 (D) LIEN ON LANDS SERVICED BY SYSTEM. To the extent
22 permitted by law, the Water Authority will cause a lien to be perfected upon each lot
23 or parcel of land for delinquent charges imposed for water and sanitary sewer
24 services supplied by the System to the owner of such lot or parcel. The Water
25 Authority will take all necessary steps to enforce the lien against any parcel of
26 property the owner of which is delinquent for more than six months in the payment of
27 charges imposed by the Water Authority.

28 (E) LEVY OF CHARGES. The Water Authority will promptly fix,
29 establish and levy the rates and charges which are required by Section 29.(C). No
30 reduction in any initial or existing rate schedule for the System may be made unless:

31 (1) the Water Authority has fully complied with the provisions

1 of Section 21 of this Bond Ordinance for any 12 consecutive months out of the 16
2 calendar months immediately preceding the reduction of the rate schedule, and

3 (2) the audit required by Section 29.(I) or a separate
4 certificate by an Independent Accountant for or relating to any 12 consecutive
5 months out of the 16 calendar months immediately preceding any reduction
6 discloses that the estimated Net Revenues resulting from the proposed reduced rate
7 schedule would have been sufficient to meet the Rate Covenant during the
8 applicable 12-month period.

9 (F) EFFICIENT OPERATION. The Water Authority will maintain the
10 System in efficient operating condition and make such improvements, extensions,
11 enlargements, repairs and betterments to the System as may be necessary or
12 advisable for its economical and efficient operation at all times and to supply
13 reasonable public and private demands for System services within the area served
14 by the Water Authority.

15 (G) RECORDS. So long as the Bonds remain Outstanding, the
16 Water Authority will keep, or cause to be kept, proper books of record and account,
17 separate from all other records and accounts, showing complete and correct entries
18 of all transactions relating to the System.

19 (H) RIGHT TO INSPECT. Owners, or their duly authorized agents,
20 shall have the right to inspect at all reasonable times all records, accounts and data
21 relating to the System; however, pursuant to Section 6-14-10(E) NMSA 1978,
22 records with regard to the ownership or pledge of the Bonds are not subject to
23 inspection or copying.

24 (I) AUDITS. So long as the Bonds are Outstanding, within 270
25 days following the close of each Fiscal Year, the Water Authority will cause an audit
26 of the books and accounts of the System to be made by an Independent Accountant.
27 Each audit of the System shall include those matters determined to be proper by the
28 Independent Accountant.

29 (J) BILLING PROCEDURE. Bills for water, water services or
30 facilities, sanitary sewer service or facilities, or any combination thereof, furnished by
31 or through the System shall be provided to customers on a regular basis each month

1 following the month in which the service was rendered and shall be due as required
2 by Water Authority ordinance. If permitted by law, if a bill is not paid within the
3 period of time required by Water Authority ordinance, water and sanitary sewer
4 services shall be discontinued as required by Water Authority ordinance, and the
5 rates and charges due shall be collected in a lawful manner, including but not limited
6 to the cost of disconnection and reconnection.

7 (K) CHARGES AND LIENS UPON SYSTEM. The Water Authority
8 will pay when due from Gross Revenues or other legally available funds all taxes
9 and assessments or other municipal or governmental charges, lawfully levied or
10 assessed upon the System and will observe and comply with all valid requirements
11 of any municipal or governmental authority relating to the System. The Water
12 Authority will not create or permit any lien or charge upon the System or the Gross
13 Revenues or Net Revenues except as permitted by this Bond Ordinance, or it will
14 make adequate provisions to satisfy and discharge within 60 days after the same
15 accrue, all lawful claims and demands for labor, materials, supplies or other objects,
16 which, if unpaid, might by law become a lien upon the System, the Gross Revenues
17 or the Net Revenues. However, the Water Authority shall not be required to pay or
18 cause to be discharged, or make provision for any tax assessment, lien or charge
19 before the time when payment becomes due or so long as the validity thereof is
20 contested in good faith by appropriate legal proceedings and there is no adverse
21 effect on Owners.

22 (L) INSURANCE. In its operation of the System, the Water
23 Authority will carry fire and extended coverage insurance. As required by law, the
24 Water Authority will acquire insurance or maintain a self-insurance fund to cover
25 workmen's compensation insurance and public liability insurance. In the event of
26 property loss or damage to the System, insurance proceeds shall be used first for
27 the purpose of restoring or replacing the property lost or damaged and any
28 remainder shall be treated as Gross Revenues.

29 (M) ALIENATING SYSTEM. Except as permitted in this Bond
30 Ordinance, while any Bonds are Outstanding, the Water Authority will not sell, lease,
31 mortgage, pledge or otherwise encumber, or in any manner dispose of, or otherwise

1 alienate, any part of the System, except that the Water Authority may sell any
2 portion of the property of the System which is replaced by other property of at least
3 equal value, or which ceases to be necessary for the efficient operation of the
4 System. In the event of any sale of System property, the proceeds of such sale
5 which are not used to purchase other System property shall be distributed as Gross
6 Revenues.

7 (N) EXTENDING INTEREST PAYMENTS. To prevent any
8 accumulation of claims for interest after maturity, except as permitted by this Bond
9 Ordinance, the Water Authority will not directly or indirectly extend or assent to the
10 extension of the time for the payment of any claim for interest on the Bonds. If the
11 time for payment of interest is extended contrary to the provisions of this Section, the
12 installments of interest extended shall not be entitled, in case of an event of default
13 under this Bond Ordinance, to the benefit or security of this Bond Ordinance until the
14 prior payment in full of the principal of and interest on all other Bonds then
15 Outstanding.

16 (O) COMPETENT MANAGEMENT. The Water Authority shall
17 employ experienced and competent personnel to manage the System.

18 (P) PERFORMING DUTIES. The Water Authority will faithfully and
19 punctually perform all duties with respect to the System required by State, City and
20 County laws including, but not limited to, making and collecting reasonable and
21 sufficient rates and charges for services rendered or furnished by the System as
22 required by this Section and the proper segregation and application of the Gross
23 Revenues.

24 (Q) OTHER LIENS. Other than as stated in or provided by the
25 Bond Legislation, there are no liens or encumbrances of any nature whatsoever on
26 or against the System or Gross Revenues or Net Revenues.

27 (R) WATER AUTHORITY'S EXISTENCE. The Water Authority will
28 maintain its corporate identity and existence as long as the Bonds remain
29 outstanding.

30 (S) TAX COMPLIANCE. The Water Authority covenants that it will
31 use, and will restrict the use and investment of, the proceeds of the Bonds in such

1 manner and to such extent as may be necessary so that (a) the Bonds will not (i)
2 constitute private activity bonds, arbitrage bonds or hedge bonds under Sections
3 141, 148 or 149 of the Code or (ii) be treated other than as bonds to which Section
4 103(a) of the Code applies, and (b) the interest thereon will not be treated as a
5 preference item under Section 57 of the Code.

6 The Water Authority further covenants (a) that it will take or cause to be taken
7 such actions that may be required of it for the interest on the Bonds to be and to
8 remain excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, (b) that it will
9 not take or authorize to be taken any actions that would adversely affect that
10 exclusion, and (c) that it, or persons acting for it, will, among other acts of
11 compliance, (i) apply the proceeds of the Bonds to the governmental purposes of the
12 borrowings, (ii) restrict the yield on investment property, (iii) make timely and
13 adequate rebate payments or payments of alternative amounts in lieu of rebate to
14 the federal government, (iv) maintain books and records and make calculations and
15 reports, and (v) refrain from certain uses of those proceeds and, as applicable, of
16 property financed with such proceeds, all in such manner to the extent necessary to
17 assure such exclusion of that interest under the Code.

18 Authorized Officers are hereby authorized (a) to make or effect any election,
19 selection, designation, choice, consent, approval, or waiver on behalf of the Water
20 Authority as the Water Authority is permitted or required to make or give under the
21 federal income tax laws including, without limitation thereto, any of the elections
22 provided for in Section 148(f)(4)(C) of the Code or available under Section 148 of the
23 Code, for the purpose of assuring, enhancing or protecting favorable tax treatment
24 or status of the Bonds or interest thereon or assisting in the compliance with
25 requirements for that purpose, reducing the burden or expense of such compliance,
26 reducing the rebate amount or payments of penalties, or making payments of special
27 amounts in lieu of making computations to determine, or paying, excess earnings as
28 rebate, or obviating those amounts or payments, as determined by that officer, which
29 action shall be in writing and signed by the Authorized Officer, (b) to take any and all
30 other actions, make or obtain calculations, make payments, and make or give
31 reports, covenants and certifications of and on behalf of the Water Authority, as may

1 be appropriate to assure the exclusion of interest from gross income and the
2 intended tax status of the Bonds, and (c) to give one or more appropriate certificates
3 of the Water Authority, for inclusion in the transcripts of the proceedings for the
4 Bonds, setting forth the reasonable expectations of the Water Authority regarding
5 the amount and use of all the proceeds of the Bonds, the facts, circumstances and
6 estimates on which they are based, and other facts and circumstances relevant to
7 the tax treatment of the interest on and the tax status of the Bonds.

8 Section 30. REBATE FUND. A separate account of the Rebate Fund shall
9 not be required for the Bonds provided that the Water Authority shall comply with the
10 provisions of Section 29.(S).

11 Section 31. EVENTS OF DEFAULT. Each of the following events is
12 declared an "event of default" under this Bond Ordinance:

13 (A) NONPAYMENT OF PRINCIPAL OR ACCRETED VALUE.
14 Failure to pay the principal or Accreted Value of the Bonds or any Senior Obligations
15 or Subordinate Obligations when due and payable, either at maturity or otherwise.

16 (B) NONPAYMENT OF INTEREST. Failure to pay any installment
17 of interest on the Bonds or Subordinate Obligations when due and payable.

18 (C) INCAPABLE OF PERFORMING. For any reason, the Water
19 Authority becomes incapable of fulfilling its obligations under this Bond Ordinance.

20 (D) DEFAULTS OF ANY OTHER PROVISION. Default by the
21 Water Authority in the due and punctual performance of its covenants, conditions,
22 agreements and provisions contained in System Obligations or in the Water
23 Authority ordinance authorizing those System Obligations and the continuance of
24 such default (other than a default set forth in paragraphs A, B and C of this Section)
25 for 60 days after written notice specifying such default and requiring the same to be
26 remedied has been given to the Water Authority by any Credit Source or the Owners
27 of 25% in principal amount and Accreted Value of the System Obligations then
28 Outstanding.

29 Section 32. REMEDIES UPON DEFAULT. Upon the happening and
30 continuance of any of the events of default stated in Section 31:

31 (1) any applicable Credit Source may proceed with any

1 available remedies under any Credit Facility; and

2 (2) the Owners of not less than 66% in principal amount and
3 Accreted Value of the System Obligations then Outstanding, including but not limited
4 to a trustee or trustees therefor, with the consent of the Credit Source with respect to
5 Insured Obligations, may proceed against the Water Authority or the Board or both
6 to:

7 (a) protect and enforce the rights of the Owners by
8 mandamus or other suit, action or special proceedings in equity or at law, in any
9 court of competent jurisdiction, either for the appointment of a receiver or for the
10 specific performance of any covenant or agreement contained in this Bond
11 Ordinance or for the enforcement of any proper legal or equitable remedy as those
12 Owners may deem necessary or desirable to protect and enforce their rights,

13 (b) to enjoin any act or thing which may be unlawful or
14 in violation of any right of any Owner,

15 (c) to require the Board to act as if it were the trustee
16 of an express trust, or

17 (d) any combination of those remedies.

18 All proceedings shall be instituted and maintained for the equal benefit of all
19 Owners of System Obligations then Outstanding, subject to the provisions of Section
20 21 of this Bond Ordinance, with respect to the use of Gross Revenues. The Owners
21 by purchasing System Obligations consent to the appointment of a receiver to
22 protect the rights of the Owners. The receiver may enter and take possession of
23 and operate and maintain the System and shall prescribe rates, fees or charges and
24 collect, receive and apply all Gross Revenues as required by this Bond Ordinance.
25 The failure of any Owner to exercise any right granted by this Section shall not
26 relieve the Water Authority of any obligation to perform any duty. Each right or
27 privilege of any Owner (or trustee or receiver therefor) is in addition and cumulative
28 to any other right or privilege and the exercise of any right or privilege by or on
29 behalf of any Owner shall not be deemed a waiver of any other right or privilege of
30 any Owner.

1 Notwithstanding any other provision in this Bond Ordinance, no recourse shall
2 be had for the payment of any Bond or for any claim based on any other obligation,
3 covenant or agreement contained in this Bond Ordinance against any past, present
4 or future officer, employee or agent of the Water Authority or member of the Board,
5 and all such liability of any such officers, employees, agents or member (as such) is
6 released as a condition of and consideration for the adoption of the Bond
7 Legislation, execution of the Continuing Disclosure Undertaking and the issuance of
8 the Bonds.

9 Upon the occurrence and continuance of an Event of Default, so long as the
10 Credit Source, if any, is not in default in its payment obligations under the Bond
11 Insurance Policy, the Credit Source shall be entitled to control and direct the
12 enforcement of all rights and remedies granted to the Owners with respect to
13 Insured Obligations and such Credit Source shall also be entitled to direct and
14 approve all waivers of Events of Default with respect to Insured Obligations.

15 Section 33. DUTIES UPON DEFAULT. Upon the happening of any of the
16 events of default listed in Section 31, the Water Authority will do and perform all
17 proper acts on behalf of and for the Owners necessary to protect and preserve the
18 security created for the payment of the System Obligations and for the payment of
19 the Debt Service Requirements on the System Obligations promptly as the same
20 become due. As long as any of the System Obligations are Outstanding, all Gross
21 Revenues shall be distributed and used for the purpose and with the priorities set
22 forth in Section 21. If the Water Authority fails or refuses to proceed as provided in
23 this Section, the Owners of not less than 66% in principal amount and Accreted
24 Value of the System Obligations then Outstanding, after demand in writing, may
25 proceed to protect and enforce the rights of the Owners as provided in the Bond
26 Legislation.

27 Section 34. DEFEASANCE. When all principal, interest and prior
28 redemption premiums, if any, in connection with all or any part of the Bonds have
29 been paid or provided for (including amounts owed to the Credit Source, if any,
30 under any Bond Insurance Policy), the pledge and lien and all obligations under this
31 Bond Legislation with respect to those Bonds and any Bond Insurance Policy shall

1 be discharged and those Bonds shall no longer be deemed to be Outstanding within
2 the meaning of the Bond Legislation.

3 Without limiting the preceding paragraph, there shall be deemed to be such
4 payment when: (i) the Board has caused to be placed in escrow and in trust with an
5 escrow agent located within or without the State and exercising trust powers, an
6 amount sufficient (including the known minimum yield from Defeasance Obligations
7 in which such amount may be initially invested) to pay all requirements of principal,
8 interest and prior redemption premium, if any, on the Bonds to be defeased as the
9 same become due to the final maturities or upon designated prior redemption dates,
10 and (ii) any Bonds to be redeemed prior to maturity shall have been duly called for
11 redemption or irrevocable instructions to call such Bonds for redemption have been
12 given to the Registrar. The escrow agent shall have received evidence satisfactory
13 to it that the cash and Defeasance Obligations delivered will be sufficient to provide
14 for the payment of the Bonds to be defeased as stated above. Neither the
15 Defeasance Obligations nor money deposited with the escrow agent shall be
16 withdrawn or used for any purpose other than as provided in the escrow agreement
17 and the Defeasance Obligations and money shall be segregated and held in trust for
18 the payment of the principal and premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds with
19 respect to which such deposit has been made. The Defeasance Obligations shall
20 become due prior to the respective times at which the proceeds are needed in
21 accordance with a schedule established and agreed upon between the Board and
22 the escrow agent at the time of the creation of the escrow, or the Defeasance
23 Obligations shall be subject to redemption but only at the option of the holders or
24 owners thereof to assure the availability of the proceeds as needed to meet the
25 schedule.

26 Until reimbursement is made by the Water Authority to the applicable Credit
27 Source, if the principal and/or interest due on Insured Obligations is paid by a Credit
28 Source pursuant to a Credit Facility, the applicable Insured Obligations shall remain
29 Outstanding, shall not be defeased or otherwise satisfied and shall not be
30 considered to be paid by the Water Authority. In such case, the assignment and
31 pledge of the Net Revenues for the payment of the Insured Obligations paid by the

1 Credit Source and all covenants, agreements and other obligations of the Water
2 Authority to the Owners of those Insured Obligations shall continue to exist and shall
3 run to the benefit of that Credit Source and that Credit Source shall be subrogated to
4 the rights of the owners of those Insured Obligations, until all obligations of the
5 Water Authority to that Credit Source have been paid.

6 If any Bonds are deemed to be paid and discharged pursuant to this Section,
7 within 15 days after the date of defeasance, the Water Authority shall cause written
8 notice to be given to each Owner of the Bonds deemed paid and discharged at the
9 address shown on the Bond register on the date on which those Bonds are deemed
10 paid and discharged. The notice shall state the numbers of the Bonds deemed paid
11 and discharged (if less than all the Bonds are deemed paid and discharged),
12 describe the Defeasance Obligations and specify any date or dates on which the
13 Bonds defeased are to be called for redemption pursuant to notice of redemption
14 given or irrevocable provisions made for that notice pursuant to this Section.

15 Notwithstanding the foregoing, any provisions of the Bond Legislation which
16 relate to indemnification and the payment of fees and expenses, the payment of the
17 principal of and premium of Bonds at maturity or on a prior redemption date, interest
18 payments and dates thereof, exchange, registration of transfer and registration of
19 Bonds, replacement of mutilated, destroyed, lost or stolen Bonds, the safekeeping
20 and cancellation of Bonds, non-presentment of Bonds, the holding of money in trust,
21 the obligations set forth in this Bond Ordinance regarding rebate, and the duties of
22 the Registrar, Authenticating Agent and Paying Agent in connection with all of the
23 foregoing shall remain in effect and be binding upon the Owners, the Registrar,
24 Authenticating Agent and Paying Agent notwithstanding the release and discharge
25 of the Bond Legislation. The provisions of this Section shall survive the release,
26 discharge and satisfaction of the Bond Legislation.

27 Section 35. BONDS NOT PRESENTED WHEN DUE. If any Bonds are not
28 duly presented for payment when due at maturity or on any prior redemption date,
29 and if money sufficient for the payment of those Bonds is on deposit with the Paying
30 Agent, and, in the case of the Bonds to be redeemed, if notice of redemption has
31 been given as provided in the Bond Legislation, all liability of the Water Authority to

1 the Owners of those Bonds shall be discharged, those Bonds shall no longer be
2 Outstanding and it shall be the duty of the Paying Agent to segregate and to hold
3 such money in trust, without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the
4 Owners of those Bonds.

5 Section 36. DELEGATED POWERS. The officers of the Water Authority
6 are authorized and directed to take all action from time to time which is necessary or
7 appropriate to effectuate the provisions of the Bond Legislation and the Bonds,
8 including, without limitation, the execution of any credit facility, any liquidity
9 agreement, any remarketing agreement, any qualified exchange agreement, the
10 delivery of a "deemed final" certificate relating to the disclosure document for the
11 Bonds, the publication of a summary of this Bond Ordinance substantially in the form
12 set out in Section 45, the distribution of material related to the Bonds, the printing of
13 the Bonds and the execution of related documents and certificates pertaining to the
14 System, the Bonds, and the delivery of and security for the Bonds, as may be
15 reasonably required by the Purchaser. The officers of the Water Authority are
16 authorized and directed to take all action from time to time which is desirable or
17 necessary for the Water Authority with respect to arbitrage rebate requirements
18 under Section 148(f) of the Code.

19 The Executive Director of the Water Authority, or his successor in interest, is
20 hereby authorized and directed to make such changes or corrections to the
21 procedures established in the Bond Legislation relating to the times of day or the
22 days on which actions are required to be taken, or the persons responsible for
23 particular actions, the form of notice of the occurrence of events, the types and
24 forms of actions required and other similar administrative matters which, in his
25 judgment, are necessary and appropriate to accomplish the purposes of the Bond
26 Legislation and to provide for the efficient administration of the System and the
27 Bonds. Notice of any such changes or corrections shall be given to all persons
28 affected thereby and to Bond Counsel for the Water Authority and a certificate of
29 such changes and correction shall be filed with the Board.

30 Section 37. AMENDMENT OF BOND ORDINANCE.

31 (A) LIMITATIONS UPON AMENDMENTS. This Bond Ordinance

1 may be amended by ordinance or resolution of the Board without the consent of
2 Owners but with the consent of any Credit Source providing a Credit Facility which is
3 in effect and which pertains to the Bonds and is affected by the amendment if the
4 Credit Source is not in default in its obligations under the Credit Facility:

5 (1) To cure any ambiguity, or to cure, correct or supplement
6 any defect or inconsistent provision contained in this Bond Ordinance;

7 (2) To grant to the Owners any additional rights, remedies,
8 powers or authority that may lawfully be granted to them;

9 (3) To obtain or maintain a rating on the Bonds from any
10 rating agency if the amendment, in the judgment of Bond Counsel, does not
11 materially adversely affect the Owners of the Bonds;

12 (4) To achieve compliance with federal securities or tax
13 laws; and

14 (5) To make any other changes in this Bond Ordinance or
15 the Confirming Resolution which, in the opinion of Bond Counsel, are not materially
16 adverse to the Owners.

17 (B) ADDITIONAL AMENDMENTS. Except as provided above or in
18 the Confirming Resolution, the Bond Ordinance may only be amended or
19 supplemented by ordinance or resolution adopted by the Board in accordance with
20 the laws of the State, without receipt by the Water Authority of any additional
21 consideration, but with the written consent of the Owners of a majority of the
22 principal amount of the Bonds then Outstanding which are affected by the
23 amendment or supplement (not including the Bonds which are then owned by or for
24 the account of the Water Authority) and of any Credit Source providing a Credit
25 Facility which is in effect affected by the amendment or supplement, if the Credit
26 Source is not in default in its obligations under the Credit Facility; provided, however,
27 that no such ordinances or resolutions shall have the effect of permitting:

28 (1) An extension of the maturity of any Bond; or

29 (2) A reduction in the principal amount of, premium, if any, or
30 interest rate on any Bond; or

31 (3) The creation of a lien on or a pledge of Net Revenues

1 ranking prior to the lien or pledge of Subordinate Obligations on Net Revenues
2 unless issued in compliance with the ordinances authorizing the issuance of the
3 Outstanding Senior Obligations; or

4 (4) A reduction of the principal amount of the Bonds required
5 for consent to such amendment or supplement.

6 (C) PROOF OF INSTRUMENTS. The fact and date of the
7 execution of any instrument under the provisions of this Section may be proved by
8 the certificate of any officer in any jurisdiction who by the laws of that jurisdiction is
9 authorized to take acknowledgments of deeds within that jurisdiction that the person
10 signing the instrument acknowledged before him the execution of that instrument, or
11 may be proved by an affidavit of a witness to the execution sworn to before such
12 officer.

13 Section 38. LIMITATION OF RIGHTS. Nothing in the Bond Legislation
14 expressed or implied is intended or shall be construed to give to any Person other
15 than the Owners, the Water Authority and the parties to which such right, remedy or
16 claim is expressly granted by the Bond Legislation any legal or equitable right,
17 remedy or claim under or in respect to the Bond Legislation or any covenant,
18 condition or stipulation of the Bond Legislation, and all covenants, stipulations,
19 promises and agreements in the Bond Legislation shall be for the sole and exclusive
20 benefit of the Water Authority, the Paying Agent, the Registrar and the Owners.

21 Section 39. NOTICES. Except as otherwise specifically required in this
22 Bond Ordinance, notice with respect to the Bonds shall be effective when received
23 and it shall be sufficient service of any notice, request, demand or other paper if the
24 same is given: (i) orally, or (ii) by mail, or (iii) by Electronic Means, or (iv) hand
25 delivered; provided that any notice given orally, including notice by telephone, must
26 be confirmed by notice in writing as set forth in clause (ii), (iii) (except by telephone)
27 or (iv) above initiated within one Business Day after oral Notice is given. Notice shall
28 be given as follows:

14 Any such party may, by notice as set forth above to other parties, designate
15 any further or different address to which subsequent notices, certificates or other
16 communication shall be sent. All notices sent pursuant to this Bond Ordinance to
17 any Owner shall also be sent to the Credit Source, if any, of the Bonds.

18 When this Bond Ordinance provides for notice to the Owners of Bonds of any
19 event, such notice shall be sufficiently given (unless otherwise expressly provided in
20 this Bond Ordinance) if in writing and given in accordance with this Section to each
21 Owner of Bonds affected by such event, at his address as it appears on the register
22 for the Bonds. In any case where notice to an Owner of Bonds is given by Electronic
23 Means or by mail, neither the failure to send such notice nor any defect in any notice
24 sent to any particular Owner of Bonds shall affect the sufficiency of such notice with
25 respect to any other Owner, and any notice which is sent in the manner provided in
26 this paragraph shall conclusively be presumed to have been duly given.

27 Where this Bond Ordinance provides for notice upon the occurrence of any
28 event, that notice may be waived by the person entitled to receive that notice, either
29 before or after the event, and such waiver shall be the equivalent of notice.

30 The Paying Agent shall provide Moody's, S&P, and Fitch if the Bonds are
31 then rated by Moody's, S&P, and Fitch as applicable, with prior written notice of any

1 amendments to this Bond Ordinance and the optional redemption of Bonds pursuant
2 to Section 8.(A) or defeasance pursuant to Section 34. Such notice shall be sent (a)
3 to Moody's at: Moody's Investors Service, Public Finance Department – Structured
4 Finance Group, 99 Church Street, New York, New York 10007, (b) to S&P at:
5 Standard & Poor's Corporation, Attention: Municipal Finance Department –

8 Section 40. AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. F/S O-08-4. To provide
9 consistent provisions on the Water Authority's Outstanding Subordinate Obligations,
10 and to codify the amendment to the loan agreement (the "Amendment") for the
11 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Loan Agreement (2008), Ordinance No. F/S
12 O-08-4 is hereby amended as follows:

13 (A). The definition of Ordinance shall be amended in its entirety to read as
14 follows:

15 "ORDINANCE. This Ordinance as amended by Ordinance No. O-14-2, and
16 as further amended or supplemented from time to time."

17 (B) All references to "Parity Obligations" shall be substituted with the term
18 "Senior Obligations."

19 (C) The term "Subordinated Obligations" shall be substituted with the term
20 "Subordinate Obligations" and defined as follows: The Loan Agreement and
21 all other bonds and other obligations of the Water Authority now or hereafter
22 issued with a lien on the Net Revenues subordinate to the liens of the Senior
23 Obligations on the Net Revenues and superior to the lien of the Super
24 Subordinate Obligations on the Net Revenues."

25 (D) There shall be added a definition of "Super Subordinate Obligations"
26 which shall be defined as "Bonds and other obligations of the Water Authority
27 now or hereafter issued with a lien on the Net Revenues subordinate to the
28 lien of the Senior Obligations and subordinate to lien of the Subordinate
29 Obligations on the Net Revenues.

30 (E) Section 19.(D) shall be replaced in its entirety with the following.

31 "(D) (Reserved)."

1 (F) Section 19.(F)(1) and (2)(a)(b) relating to the requirements for issuing
2 additional Subordinate Obligations shall require the Water Authority to satisfy
3 the test set forth in Section 19(B) related to the issuance of additional Senior
4 Obligations in addition to the test set forth in Section 19(F) prior to issuing
5 additional Subordinate Obligations. Additionally, Section 19.(F)(1) and
6 (2)(a)(b) shall be further amended to substitute references to 125% with
7 120%.

8 (G) Section 21.(C)(1) shall be replaced in its entirety as follows:

9 (C) RATE COVENANT

10 (1) The Water Authority will charge all purchasers of
11 services of the System, including the Water Authority, the City and the County, such
12 reasonable and just rates as are sufficient to produce Net Revenues annually to pay
13 120% of the annual Debt Service Requirements on all Senior Obligations and
14 Subordinate Obligations (excluding the accumulation of any reserves therefor).”

15 (H) All other provisions of Ordinance No. F/S O-08-4 are hereby affirmed.

16 (I) The Amendment is hereby approved.

17 Section 41. AMENDMENTS TO WATER AND SEWER RATE ORDINANCE
18 NO. O-14-1 AND DEBT POLICY.

19 A. Section 1-1-2(A) shall be amended as follows:

20 1. The definition of “Current Debt Service Requirements”
21 shall be amended in its entirety to read as follows:

22 “Debt Service Requirements” With respect to System Obligations for
23 any given period, the sum of: (1) the amount required to pay the interest, or to
24 make reimbursements for payments of interest, becoming due on System
25 Obligations during that period, plus (2) the amount required to pay the
26 principal or Accreted Value, becoming due on System Obligations during that
27 period, whether at maturity, an accretion term date or upon mandatory sinking
28 fund redemption dates, plus (3) the periodic payments required to be made by
29 the Water Authority pursuant to a Qualified Exchange Agreement minus (4)
30 the periodic payments to be received by the Water Authority pursuant to a
31 Qualified Exchange Agreement. No payments required for any System

1 Obligations which may be tendered or otherwise presented for payment at the
2 option or demand of the owners of System Obligations, or which may occur
3 because of the exercise of an option by the Water Authority, or which may
4 otherwise become due by reason of any other circumstance or contingency,
5 including acceleration or early termination payments, which constitute other
6 than regularly scheduled payments of principal, Accreted Value, interest or
7 other regularly scheduled payments on System Obligations shall be included
8 in any computation of Debt Service Requirements for that period.

9 2. The following definitions shall be added:

10 NET REVENUES. The Revenues of the Utility less the
11 Expenses. For purposes of calculating compliance with Sections 1-1-2(B) and 1-1-
12 2(C) and the Additional Bonds Tests and Rate Covenants in the Debt Management
13 and Policy & Guidelines, Net Revenues shall be defined and calculated in
14 accordance with the definition of Net Revenues established in the applicable
15 ordinance authorizing the issuance of the relevant System Obligations.

16 SENIOR OBLIGATIONS. System Obligations now outstanding
17 or hereafter issued with a first lien, but not an exclusive first lien, on the Net
18 Revenues on a parity with the lien of the Outstanding Senior Obligations.

19 SUBORDINATE OBLIGATIONS. System Obligations now
20 outstanding or hereafter issued with a lien on the Net Revenues subordinate to the
21 lien thereon of the Senior Obligations but superior to the lien thereon of the Super
22 Subordinate Obligations.

23 SUPER SUBORDINATED OBLIGATIONS. System Obligations
24 now outstanding or hereafter issued with a lien on the Net Revenue subordinate to
25 the lien thereon of the Senior Obligations and subordinate to the lien thereon of the
26 Subordinate Obligations.

27 SYSTEM OBLIGATIONS. All bonds and other similar indebted
28 ness payable solely or primarily from the Net Revenues, including, without limitation,
29 the Senior Obligations, the Subordinate Obligations, and the Super Subordinated
30 Obligations.

31 3. Section 1-1-2(C) shall be amended in its entirety as follows:

1 (C) Increasing Minimum Monthly Fixed Charges. So long as there are
2 Senior Obligations outstanding, if the determination of §1-1-2(B) above shows that
3 the Net Revenues are less than 133 percent of the Debt Service Requirements on
4 the outstanding Senior Obligations, the fixed monthly charge will be increased for
5 water and sewer accounts. So long as there are Subordinate Obligations
6 outstanding, if the determination of §1-1-2(B) above shows that the Net Revenues
7 are less than 120 percent of the Debt Service Requirements on the outstanding
8 Senior Obligations and outstanding Subordinate Obligations, the fixed monthly
9 charge will be increased for water and sewer accounts. The increase in the fixed
10 monthly charges will be a percentage of the established fixed monthly charges that
11 produce additional revenues so that if the adjusted charges had been effective the
12 previous quarter, the total Net Revenues would have been sufficient to meet the
13 requirements of this paragraph. as applicable. If the determination of §1-1-2(B)
14 above shows that the Net Revenues are insufficient to meet the requirements above,
15 it shall be determined if the revenue loss is due to efforts of Water Authority
16 Customers to conserve water by reviewing usage patterns. If the usage study
17 shows that the reduced revenues are due to conservation efforts, the Executive
18 Director shall analyze the Utility's operations for the purpose of determining whether
19 or not corresponding expense reductions can be effected and shall resent any such
20 expense reduction proposals to the Water Authority.

21 4. Section V, paragraph (C) of the Debt Management Policy and
22 Guidelines is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

23 C. Additional Obligations Tests

24 (i) Additional Senior Parity Obligations. The Authority shall satisfy the
25 following test prior to issuance of any additional Senior Obligations payable from the
26 Net Revenues:

27 (1) The Net Revenues for the Historic Test Period shall
28 have been sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 133% of the maximum
29 combined annual Debt Service Requirements of only the Outstanding Senior
30 Obligations and the terms of either subparagraph 2(a) or 2(b) shall be satisfied.

31 (2) (a) Using the fees and rates for use of the System on

1 the date of computation, or assuming that any new schedule of fees and rates
2 approved by the Water Authority during or after the Historic Test Period was in effect
3 during the entire Historic Test Period, the Net Revenues which were or would have
4 been received during that Historic Test Period shall have been sufficient to pay an
5 amount representing at least 133% of the maximum combined annual Debt Service
6 Requirement on the Outstanding Senior Obligations and the Senior Obligations
7 proposed to be issued; or

8 (b) The projected Net Revenues for the Prospective
9 Test Period shall be sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 133% of the
10 maximum combined annual Debt Service Requirements on the Outstanding Senior
11 Obligations and Senior Obligations proposed to be issued. To determine if the
12 annual Net Revenues are sufficient for the purposes of the preceding sentence, the
13 Net Revenues projected for the applicable Prospective Test Period shall be
14 determined by applying the rates for use of the System approved by the Board at the
15 time of computation to be in effect during the Prospective Test Period to the
16 proposed number of connections to the System after giving effect to the purchase,
17 expansion or improvement of the System or the acquisition of an existing water and
18 sanitary sewer system.

19 (ii) Additional Subordinate Obligations. The Authority shall satisfy the
20 test set forth in subparagraph (C)(i) above related to the issuance of additional
21 Senior Obligations and shall satisfy the following test prior to issuance of any
22 additional Subordinate Obligations:

23 (1) The Net Revenues for the Historic Test Period shall have
24 been sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 120% of the maximum
25 combined annual Debt Service Requirements of only the Outstanding Senior
26 Obligations and the Outstanding Subordinate Obligations and the terms of either
27 subparagraph 2(a) or 2(b) shall be satisfied.

28 (2) (a) Using the fees and rates for use of the System on
29 the date of computation, or assuming that any new schedule of fees and rates
30 approved by the Water Authority during or after the Historic Test Period was in effect
31 during the entire Historic Test Period, the Net Revenues which were or would have

1 been received during that Historic Test Period shall have been sufficient to pay an
2 amount representing at least 120% of the maximum combined annual Debt Service
3 Requirement on the Outstanding Senior Obligations and Outstanding Subordinate
4 Obligations and the Subordinate Obligations proposed to be issued; or

5 (b) The projected Net Revenues for the Prospective
6 Test Period shall be sufficient to pay an amount representing at least 120% of the
7 maximum combined annual Debt Service Requirements on the Outstanding Senior
8 Obligations and Outstanding Subordinate Obligations and the Subordinate
9 Obligations proposed to be issued. To determine if the annual Net Revenues are
10 sufficient for the purposes of the preceding sentence, the projected for the applicable
11 Prospective Test Period shall be determined by applying the rates for use of the
12 System approved by the Board at the time of computation to be in effect during the
13 Prospective Test Period to the proposed number of connections to the System after
14 giving effect to the purchase, expansion or improvement of the System or the
15 acquisition of an existing water and sanitary sewer system.

16 (iii) Super Subordinate Obligations. No additional obligations test is
17 established.

18 For purposes calculating compliance with the applicable Additional Bonds
19 Test set forth in this Section, the following definitions shall apply:

20 "Historic Test Period." Any period of 12 consecutive months out of the 24
21 calendar months next preceding the delivery of additional System Obligations.

22 "Prospective Test Period." The 12-month period commencing on the first day
23 of the month following the estimated Completion Date of he project for with
24 additional system obligations are proposed to be issued or the first day of the
25 thirty-sixth month following the delivery of such additional System Obligations,
26 whichever is earlier.

27 4. Section V, paragraph (D), subsections (v) and (vi) of the Debt
28 Management Policy and Guidelines is amended to read as follows:

29 (v) Subordinate Parity Obligations. Maintain a minimum debt service
30 coverage on all Senior Obligations and Subordinate Obligations $\geq 1.20x$ Debt
31 Service Requirements on Senior Obligations and Outstanding Subordinate

1 Obligations.

2 (vi) Super Subordinated Obligations. No debt service coverage test
3 established.

4 Section 42. BOND ORDINANCE IRREPEALABLE AS TO THE BONDS.
5 After any of the Bonds are issued, this Bond Ordinance shall be and remain
6 irrevocable until the Debt Service Requirements on all the Bonds are fully paid and
7 discharged and the Bonds are canceled, as provided in this Bond Ordinance, or
8 there has been defeasance of all the Bonds as provided in this Bond Ordinance.

9 Section 43. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, paragraph, clause or
10 provision of this Bond Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or
11 unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of that section, paragraph, clause or
12 provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Bond Ordinance.

13 Section 44. REPEALER CLAUSE. All bylaws, orders, resolutions and
14 ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with this Bond Ordinance are repealed to
15 the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive
16 any bylaw, order, resolution or Ordinance, or part thereof, previously repealed.

17 Section 45. GENERAL SUMMARY FOR PUBLICATION. The title and a
18 general summary of the subject matter contained in the Ordinance shall be
