# National Water Investment Gap











As a nation, we are currently funding just one-third of our water infrastructure needs.

Some \$4.8 trillion needs to invested in water infrastructure nationwide over the next 20 years to get to a state of good repair.

The federal government spends 24 times more on IT infrastructure for federal agencies than on repairing water systems; 88 percent of Americans support increasing federal investment to rebuild our water infrastructure.

#### SUMMARY:

The Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority (Water Authority) has been recognized for the second time as a Utility of the Future Today. TITLE: R-19-23 - Amending Funds for the Capital Implementation Program of

the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority for the

Fiscal Year 2020

**ACTION:** Recommend Approval

#### **SUMMARY:**

This legislation appropriates additional funding for the FY20 Capital Implementation Program (CIP). This appropriation allows for carryover of all unobligated funds remaining at the end of the 2019 fiscal year and miscellaneous adjustments to the fiscal year 2020 budget for current contractual commitments.

#### FISCAL IMPACT:

The FY20 capital program appropriation totals \$68.3 million, which has been previously approved through Resolution R-19-9. Capital funds categories that have an excess/deficit budget amount carry their cumulative balance from one year to the next. This means the Water Authority starts the fiscal year with more money in a category if underspent in previous years, or with less money in a category if overspent.

The Water Authority Financial Services Division (FSD) shall record carryover of all unobligated funds remaining at the end of a budget year to the next budget year to cover allowable costs in that budget period. Restricted funds, grants, bond and loan proceeds, and cash transfers that are recorded in Capital funds are the only cumulative balances allowed.

The FY19 carryover amount totals \$55,371,482, which is detailed below in the various decade line categories:

TITLE: R-19-24 - Authorizing the Removal of Certain Uncollectable Accounts

from the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority

Accounts Receivable Records FY2015 and Prior

**ACTION:** Recommend Approval

#### SUMMARY:

This legislation provides information to support a request to the Board authorizing the removal of uncollectable accounts greater than four (4) years old totaling \$35,821.39.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Since 1965, pursuant to NMSA 1978, § 3-37-7, New Mexico municipalities have been expressly permitted to write off uncollectable debt. Counties and political subdivisions like the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Authority (Water Authority) may use the same process as a municipality to write off uncollectable debt through the procedure set forth in state law. This process will avoid an excessive accrual of accounts receivable while also accurately report the financial position of the Water Authority and comply with state debt-collection law. Further, the Water Authority should not represent to its customers, either in invoices or in any demand, that the customer owes any amount that was accrued more than four years prior to the demand.

The Chief Financial Officer (CFO) of the Water Authority states that:

- a) a utility account or any unsecured account services have been incurred;
- b) diligent efforts were made to collect the utility account or unsecured account and to locate a debtor:
- c) that the utility account or unsecured account has been uncollectable for a period of more than four years; and
- d) that in his opinion the utility account or unsecured account is uncollectable.

Staff recommends authorization to remove the uncollectable accounts as shown in Exhibit A.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to NMSA 1978 § Section 3-37-7, pertaining to the determinations of uncollectable accounts and their removal from accounts receivable, the Chief Financial Officer (CFO) has submitted herewith a list of accounts receivable which were incurred in providing water and wastewater services and are owed to the Albuquerque Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority (Water Authority); and

WHEREAS, the CFO states that diligent efforts have been made to collect these accounts receivable and the respective amounts due; and

WHEREAS, the CFO has determined that these accounts receivable are uncollectable and have been uncollectable for more than four years; and

WHEREAS, the uncollectable accounts receivable have been deemed "time barred debt", defined as any debt that is not enforceable in a judicial proceeding because the applicable statute of limitations has run; and

WHEREAS, because this debt is legally uncollectable, it is not a "donation" to a private party in violation of the anti-donation clause of the New Mexico Constitution, N.M. Const. Art. IX, Section 14; and

WHEREAS, an allowance for doubtful accounts has been recorded on the Water Authority financial records which is more than sufficient to cover the uncollectable accounts; therefore, there will be no impact on the current fund balances.

#### BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WATER AUTHORITY:

The Water Authority Board finds that the Water Authority's uncollectable accounts receivable in the amount of \$35,821.39 as shown in Exhibit A which is attached hereto and by this reference made part hereof shall be removed from the Water Authority's accounts receivable records as uncollectable in accordance with provision NMSA 1978 § Section 3-37-7.

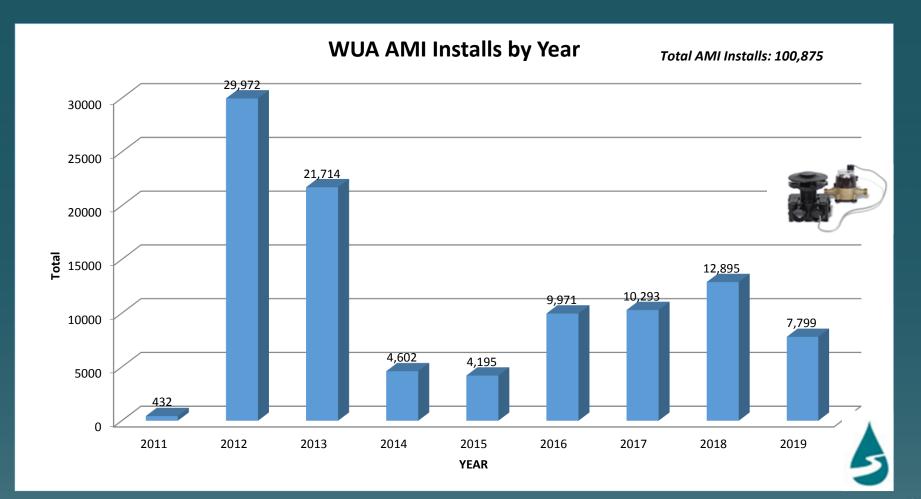


AMI System Diagram



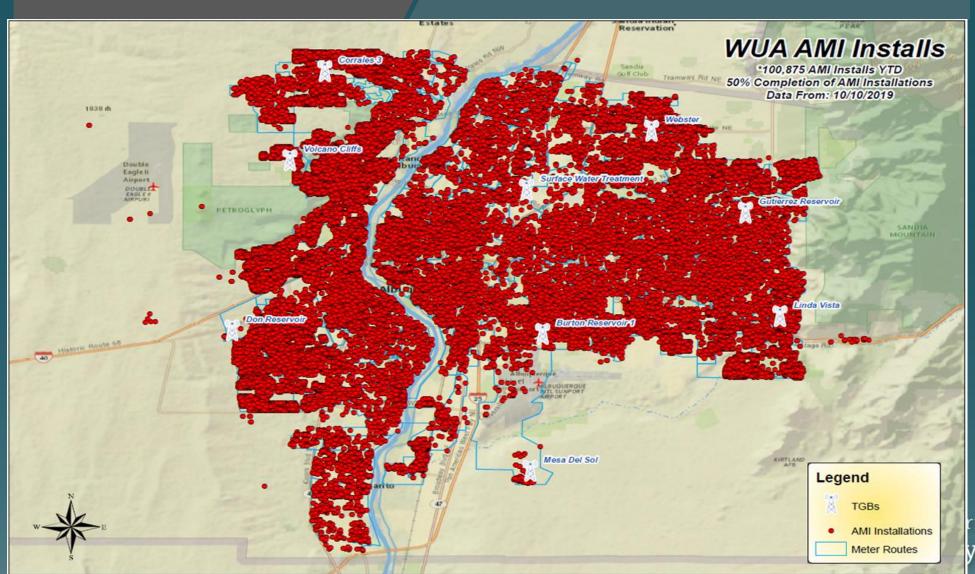
