



Conservation drought measures for 2022:

Stage 1 measures

- Double water waste fees and we doubled our compliance personnel with seasonal staff
- 3 Steps to Landscape Success Drought Class: \$20 rebate
- Increased public information encouraging the Xeriscape rebate which is now \$2 per sq ft
